Continued from page 11... proper and beneficial at other times it would be no good... Mr. Mellish—If a man came to your office complaining of bronchial trouble would you consider a continuous course of intoxicating liquor beneficial... Dr. Johnson—As a continuous course, no... Mr. Mellish—If a man came and complained of chronic trouble would you prescribe liquor? Dr. Johnson—I would be very careful to examine him before I gave him any liquor... Mr. Mellish—If a man complained of rheumatism of the kidneys would you give liquor? Dr. Johnson—Again I make the same answer... Mr. Mellish—If a man came suffering from bleeding piles? Mr. Mellish—If a man comes in and asks for a certificate for intoxicating liquor what is the course to adopt? Mr. Weeks—I must object—The witness is not an expert on the law. He would know what to do... Mr. Mellish—If a man comes in complaining of this or that should not an examination be made? His Honor—The doctor cannot answer for all the medical profession... Mr. Mellish—Well let the witness say what his personal action would be if a man came in alleging he or his wife had the gripe... Dr. Johnson—If I knew he had the gripe I might give it. I would examine him. I would refuse if I did not know he had the gripe... Mr. Mellish—Is there a standard method of gripe? Dr. Johnson—Different doctors have different remedies. Some doctors have one treatment some another. You may have to use different treatments. You would have to change the treatment according to the patient. One cannot give a certain line of treatment for a particular disease... Mr. Weeks (To Dr. Johnson) You don't mean to say intoxicating liquors were wrong to prescribe in these cases... Dr. Johnson—No, have prescribed it myself. It would be necessary to have a diagnosis. If a man came to me Dr. McNeill prescribed wrongly. I would not do it in certain cases. In case of a patient with a subnormal temperature stimulants would be good. I would like to see a patient examined by a doctor before being prescribed for. From seeing the patients here and hearing what they said I would say the treatment was not doing them good and should be changed. I cannot say more than that. I would like to know the general condition of a patient before I would prescribe liquor as a regular treatment for people in poor health.

(The doctor described the general effects of the use of intoxicating liquor as a medicine). Liquor is largely used as a domestic remedy, I believe. I would not say that it is beneficial for men who have become used to it to continue it. It would depend on the person. If I had a patient whom it was doing any good I would continue it. I have given certificates myself. I would not give them in the last three months? Dr. Johnson—About half a dozen. (laughter) Mr. Mellish—Quite a difference between that and three or four hundred. Dr. Carruthers next took the witness stand. Mr. Mellish—If a man came to your office and said he had gripe and asked you for a certificate for liquor what would you do? Dr. Carruthers—I would tell him to go to his doctor and get something else. I generally refuse. Dr. Carruthers—We usually make out our own diagnosis—we don't take the diagnosis of the patient and then prescribe for him. Mr. Mellish—By what method would you arrive at it? Dr. Carruthers—By questions and by examination. The value of liquor as a prescription depends upon the physician. Some may prescribe it without it. If a man came to me not prescribed it this winter. It might be useful in the late stages of the complaint. I think it should only be used in the stage of depression—the late stage. Stimulants are generally used for the late stages. As a stimulant a three half pint bottle might be used 24 hours. This treatment might be continued till the patient died. If a man is able to walk around I do not think he requires it as a stimulant. I don't usually write other people's prescriptions—if a man came to me asking for liquor for bronchial trouble I would examine him. I think I'd try something else first for bronchial trouble unless the patient was very weak. If the patient were able to come I'd think he could get along without it. If a man came to me saying he had rheumatism of the kidneys I would examine him to see if his kidneys were diseased before prescribing liquor. Liquor is not used so much now. I may have given three certificates myself in the last three months. To Mr. Weeks—I have prescribed liquor for patients. It used to be largely prescribed at one time. If a patient came saying he was depressed I think the doctor should examine him—they come with all sorts of stories. If the doctor was convinced the man was suffering as he

Dr. McNeill's course could be that he was unsophisticated—but he said no one could think that. He pointed out that many of the applicants were poor men who could ill afford to spend their money in this way. He did not miss the fact that some of the men had been refused liquor by the vendors, even on the certificate. He closed his able address by alleging that the doctor had been grossly negligent, and if it was impossible to get a conviction in this case, then the Prohibition Act is a farce. Dr. McNeill then briefly addressed the Court. He solemnly declared he had not given a certificate for any other than medicinal purposes. He regarded his patients as reputable men. John Flynn is a sick man, so the Dr. said. He had diagnosed his case. Doctors have to take the statements of patients as lawyers have to take those of clients. Alcohol is largely used as a domestic remedy—it is a good thing in its place. He could justify everything he had done. He thanked His Honor for his conduct of the case, and said there was nothing to rebut. His Honor then adjourned the case for judgment till next Wednesday. J.H. Bell B. W.
