AN INTERESTED VISITOR.—Mr. H. C. Hocken ex-Mayor of Toronto who has been visiting this Province for the past few days leaves on return this morning. This was Mr. Hocken's first visit to the "Garden of the Gulf" and he was so favorably impressed with the beauties of the Island that he has decided to return next summer and spend a month at one of the seaside resorts. Mr. Hocken is one of the ablest journalists in Canada—having learned the business from "Printer's Devil" up, and was for some time Managing Editor of one of Toronto's leading newspapers—the Toronto Daily News. During the past eleven years he has been the esteemed Editor of "The Sentinel"—the official organ of the Loyal Orange Association. In civil life Mr. Hocken has been highly honored by his fellow-citizens of Toronto and has served several years as a member of the Board of Control, which was followed by his being elected for two terms as Mayor, defeating his opponents in the last contest by over 18,000 of a majority. He retired voluntarily last year from civic politics and intends henceforth to devote his whole energy to the improvement of The Sentinel. The address which he delivered to the Orangemen of this city last Friday evening was both interesting and instructive. He is a fluent, forceful and pleasing speaker and the brethren here consider it a privilege indeed to have had the pleasure of hearing him. On his return to Toronto Mr. Hocken will no doubt assist in advertising the Island as a summer resort. On Saturday Mr. Hocken was the guest of Councillor Wright on a fishing expedition. While in the city he was a guest at the Victoria Hotel.

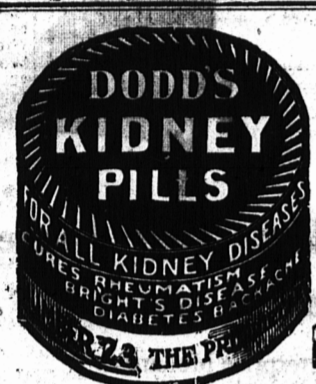
