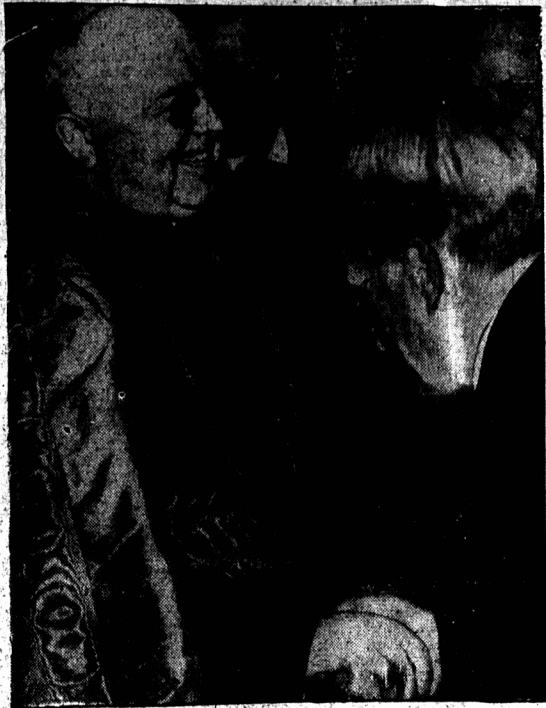


Royal Welcome Extended to Canada's First English-Speaking Cardinal

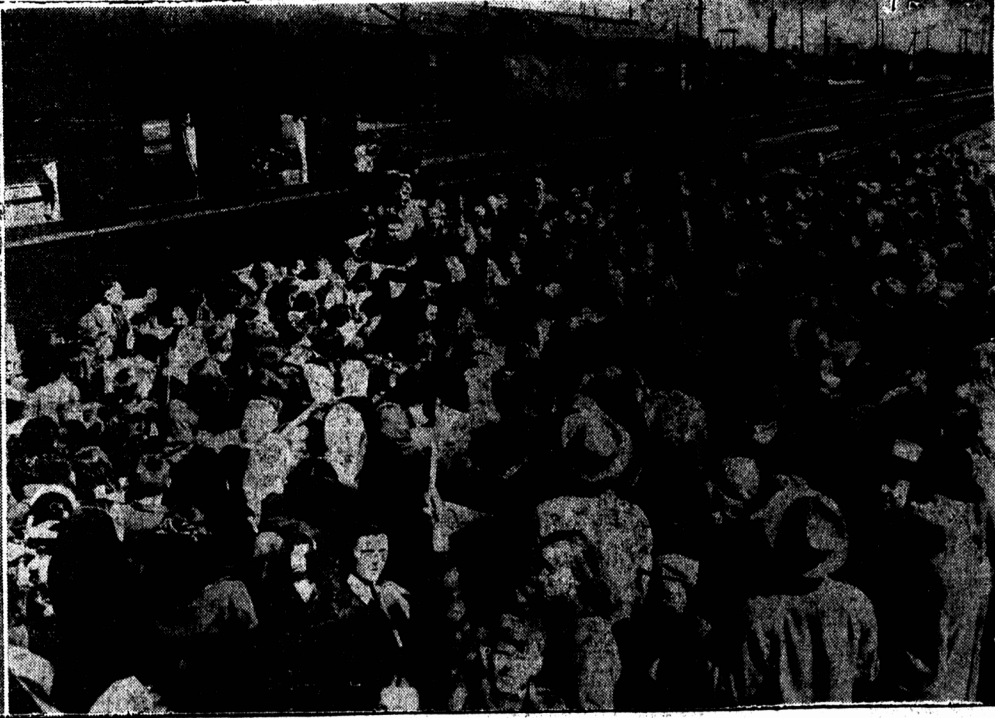

The Prince of the Catholic Church Smiled Continuously

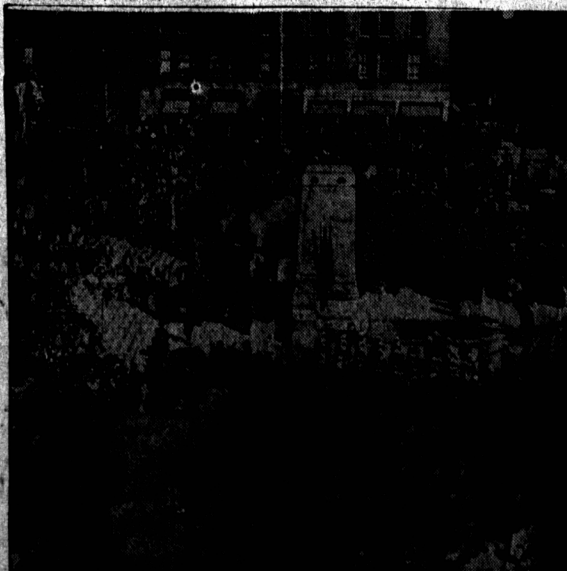

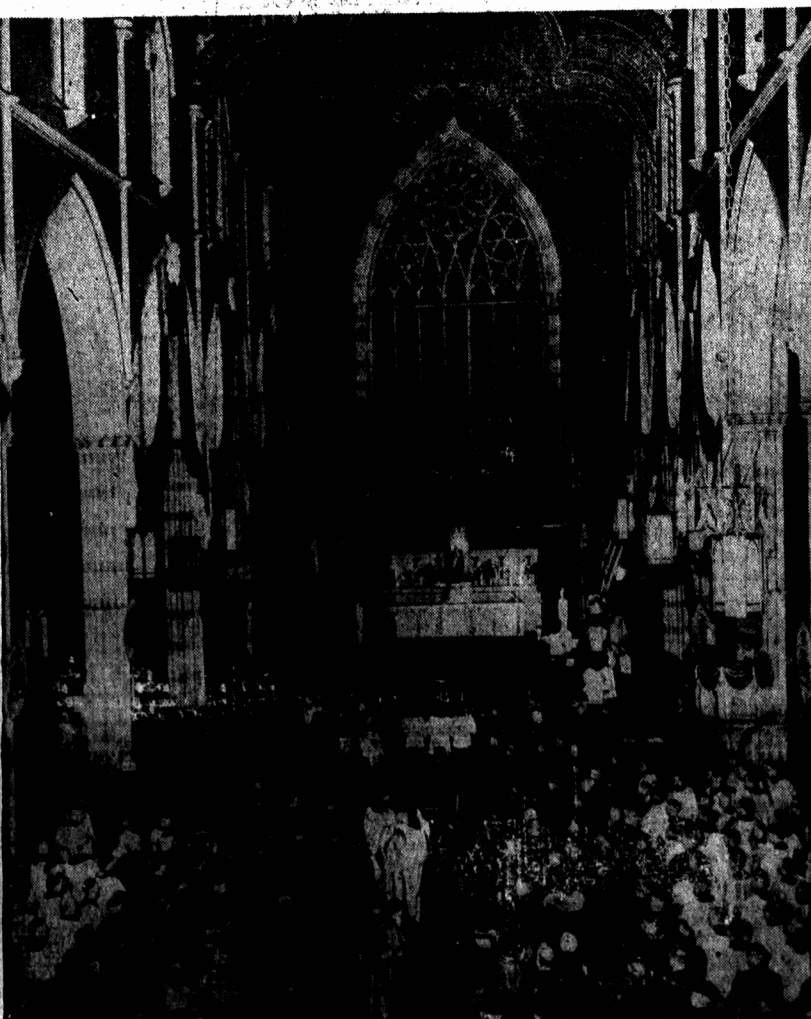
