DREDGING WILL CONTINUE IN THE ST. LAWRENCE.

MONTREAL, August 26.—The news from Ottawa that dredging operations in various parts of the country under the department of public works had been suspended owing to the appropriations voted last session having run out, caused some uneasiness in shipping circles here that the much needed work on the St. Lawrence ship channel, between Montreal and Quebec would be discontinued. Alex Johnston, deputy minister of marine and fisheries, stated when seen here tonight that there was no intention of following Mr Pugsley's example so far as his department was concerned and the dredging in the channel would go on uninterruptedly until the end of the season as usual.

GUN FIRES MILLION BULLETS A MINUTE.

ST. JOHN, August 26.—A working model on an automatic machine gun which, it is said, will discharge bullets over a range of a mile or more at the rate of 1,000,000 a minute, with a muzzle velocity of more than 3,000 feet a second and operated by a mechanical power, was demonstrated recently by the inventor, Frederick B. Bangarter.

The model, which was built to shoot a three-eighths inch bullet, was mounted behind a partition in the factory at No. 79 Broad street, Stapleton, New York. All the motive parts were covered by a tarpaulin and the machine was run by an electric motor connected with the gun by a belt. The muzzle was pointed through a hole in a partition, and the observers having gathered behind a screen, the motor was started.

The target, a pine board about half an inch thick, was placed 50 feet away. As the motor began to hum the operator turned a little wheel and a steady stream of bullets poured from the muzzle of the gun, like a stream of water from the nozzle of a hose. The target seemed to melt before the eyes as the hail of missiles struck it, and in about ten seconds the entire centre of the board had disappeared.

This model was built for round bullets, but the inventor says that on a standard make gun, which will have a half-inch bore, conical bullets will be fired, and the barrels, of which there will be two, will be rifled.

The principal use of the new gun, according to the inventor's claims, will be for operating against airships and as there is no recoil, he says, the gun can be pointed toward any point of the compass or directed up and down.

Mr. Bangarter says that the standard model will be mounted on an automobile.

EUCCHARISTIC CONGRESS MONTREAL SEPT. 6-11.

BABE'S DEATH AFTER MOTHER MADE TORONTO MAN A MILLIONAIRE.

TORONTO, Aug. 27.—Ontario province is to become richer by a handsome succession duty to the amount of more than \$200,000. The duty is 10 per cent on value of the estate of the late Mrs. Charles W. McLean, daughter of the late Senator Fullford, of Brockville.

The total value of the estate is \$2,175,000. The estate is passed to her on her father's death it went to her infant son, the child, however, surviving his mother by only six or seven hours.

The estate passed to C. W. McLean, the father of the infant, and he brought a friendly suit against the Toronto General Trusts Corporation, the executor of Mrs. McLean's will, to have his rights determined, and Justice Middleton gave judgment in accordance with the facts and approval of the settlement. It having been established by the evidence that the child survived its mother, the province will now legally collect the succession dues.

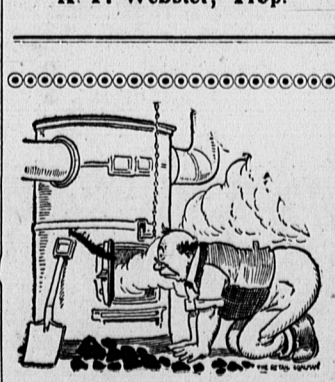

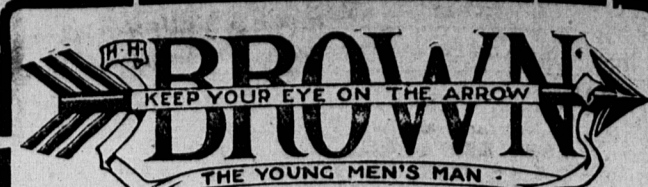
