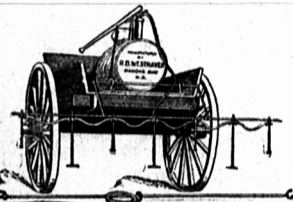

FIERCE BATTLE IN HUNGARIAN HOME

CALUMET, Mich., July 31.—Hot water, red pepper, and varous house hold utensils were used as a supplement to revolvers and bayonets in a fight between deputy sheriffs and men and women inmates of a Hungarian boarding house at Wolverine mine late today.

The arrests were part of a series which the sheriff's office has instituted within the last twenty-four hours, and the jail population was increased to one of its highest records.

The posse carried a warrant for Louis Sodder, proprietor of the boarding house, charging him with being a leader of the party that attacked Gus Olsen, a big fireman, Tuesday night.

Another woman and two men joined the Sodders, hurling red pepper at the deputies' eyes and converting chairs, cuspidors and other furniture into missiles of offense.

Seven arrests were made at the red jacket location on the northern border of Calumet to-night when troops stationed at the shaft drove away a crowd of strikers gathered about the home of William Carmichael, a foreman.

PEACE TREATY IS NOW ASSURED

LONDON, July 31.—The conclusion of a peace treaty between the warring Balkan states seems assured by the news from Bucharest, that a five days armistice was agreed on yesterday at a peace conference between the representatives of Bulgaria, Greece, Servia and Montenegro.

The war commentators of the Daily Telegraph, telegraphing from Bucharest, seem to hold the view that the prospects of permanent peace in the Balkans are as remote now as they have been at any time in the last fifty years.

—THE WEATHER.—July of this year was an exceptionally cool month as compared to that of other years. According to the returns of the meteorological station at Summerside. The highest temperature registered during the month was on the fourth, when it reached 84, while it only passed the 80 mark on two other days. It reached 81 on the twenty-seventh and 80 on the twenty-ninth. The lowest reached was on the sixteenth when it dropped to 45. The average maximum temperature for the month was 73 1/2 and the average minimum 58 5/6. The average temperature for the month was 66. Rain fell on nine different days during the month, with a total fall of over 5 1/2 inches. The hardest fall was on the twenty-fifth, when 1.45 inches fell during the 24 hours. J.
