MISS ROSELLE KNOTT IN A NEW PLAY

Severe Scoring Given This Actress Who Was well Received in Charlottetown—The Star's Critic Does Not Choose Words.

MONDAY, October 22.—The Star's work is done by Andrew Robson, whose fine voice and excellent reading of his lines caused him to shine in pronounced contrast with the slipshod methods of some of his associates. Theodore Hamilton and Eric Bligh, as William Pitt and Charles James Fox respectively, helped successfully to carry along the hopeless burden of the piece.

The story centres round the Duchesse of Devonshire, who before her marriage was Lady Georgina Spencer, and who is best known perhaps for having won a vote for Charles James Fox by having bought it from a butler with a kiss, and who later made modern police history on two occasions. The reminiscence to the Duchesse does not go much further. In the play she is a bigamist, a highwayman, and a very tiresome person. Miss Knott plays the part in the hoydenish spirit of "The Madcap Brinsford" and her work, though effective at times, is not of high class order. She is a very energetic person and bounces about the stage in a fashion as fatiguing to her audience as herself. Her conception of the character, and her delineation of it are distinctly disappointing. 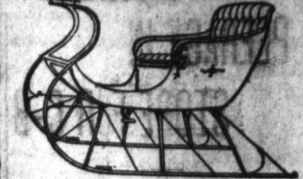

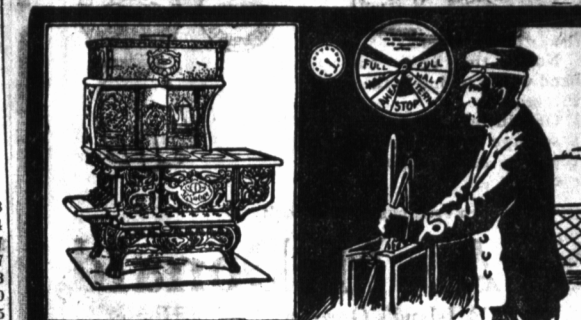
