THE DOCTORS ARE WITH US.

It is an interesting occasion that brings together in our city the members of the Maritime Medical Association in their fifteenth annual meeting. The city is honored by their visit and we hope they may find their midsummer excursion to the island so pleasant that they may come again. We must have doctors: even if half of our physical ills are imaginary or one half of the remainder the result of our own errors or our own folly.

The history of the healing art reads as romance. It has made its way from incredible darkness to a broad enlightenment; from the depths of ignorance to mountain peaks of modern scientific attainment. Think of the entire medical profession from Hippocrates to Harvey—to go no further back—treating all the diseases that flesh is heir to for thousands of years, and yet themselves ignorant of the circulation of the blood. The fact is that medical and surgical knowledge made greater progress in the nineteenth century than in all the centuries before and if Harvey were now suddenly to reappear and attempt to practice medicine along the lines and methods of his time he would be denounced as a quack.

The medical knowledge and curative or remedial agents of today have been culled from many sources. The incense of the wife of the Governor of Peru of a fever which was beyond the skill of the best physicians of that time, three hundred years ago, and the bitter bark and its product, quinine, is now used around the world. An Indian woman cured Jacques Cartier's sailors in the St. Lawrence in the winter of 1535 of an otherwise incurable and fatal scurvy, with a decoction made from the leaves of an evergreen. The English milkmaids appear to have been quite familiar with that fact that cowpox was a sure preventive of smallpox before Dr. Jenner suspected that fact.

But those were the days of darkness, and it was against insurmountable obstacles that knowledge of the human frame in health or disease made its way. Down to 1830 the laws of Massachusetts made it a felony to dissect a human body, and the Bay State was one of the more enlightened countries of the world. Bodies were obtained by stealth, cut up and studied in secrecy and fear of discovery, that knowledge might grow. Since those days have come the greater achievements of medical science, in the control of the great scourges of plague, cholera and smallpox, the lessened mortality from fevers, the better sanitation of cities and other measures that have extended the lives of millions.

The healing art from the first made some progress in the world. At times it was slow, or even at standstill and in the last century rapid, but certain broad principles have always governed it. It has been wholly cosmopolitan. It has never fallen into absolute decay. Its best representatives have always been devoted to the art for its own sake, finding in its practice their best and often their only reward. Among its most splendid recent triumphs was that of preserving the Japanese armies from disease in their arduous toils and exposures in Manchuria. And the healing brotherhood were never more alert or hopeful in their outlook for further notable achievements in their beneficent calling.

The profession is a noble one, and its members are as a body held in high esteem in all civilized lands. We may carp at their professional etiquette, and their seeming intolerance of all who seek to heal by other than the prescribed methods, but all recognize that the great body of medical practitioners has a standing as high in knowledge and character as any purely secular calling, while its individual members are among the most beloved and honored in the communities where they live and work.

The Baptists of Western Canada are now reaching out for organic union with their brethren of the east. This is natural and inevitable.

No ruler ancient or modern was ever more closely guarded than the Emperor Nicholas in his palace at Peterhof, and yet several bombs filled with dynamite have been found in the palace garden. The incident is awfully suggestive. There must be traitors among the guards, and against such no precautions can avail. The chances are that in the end Nicholas will end his life of terror in death by assassination, possibly to be succeeded by a worse ruler than himself. He is weak, rather than cruel by nature, and misguided rather than malicious.

Minister Brodeur intimated that if Mr. Lord had paid such exorbitant prices, "then if there are victims to be made we will make some." Mr. McLean M.P. protested that Mr. Lord was not responsible, but the Minister persisted that it is the duty of the agent of the Department to look after prices and "the Department will not be responsible for the action of these old officers." Whoever is responsible we know not, but it was not a very dignified proceeding on the part of the Minister to publish his threat of dismissal so widely, before inquiring into the facts of the case.
