Professional Repeater in Philadelphia Sent to Jail

Philadelphia, Dec. 8.—Judge Wiltbank, Monday morning sentenced Joseph Wetzell, a professional repeater to three years in the Eastern penitentiary, at the same time imposing a fine of \$300. Wetzell was convicted of voting illegally in the Thirty-third division of the Nine-hundred ward at the November election of 1898, and, by his own admission, he voted thirty-three times a day.

To aggravate his offense, Wetzell appeared in court intoxicated, and he interrupted the witness by remarks. His conduct became so objectionable that his lawyer withdrew. After the jury rendered their verdict Wetzell buried his face in his hands and sobbed.

Dewey an Episcopalian.

Admiral Dewey has rented a pew in St. John's Episcopal Church and has been chosen a trustee of the Episcopal Cathedral now growing up not far from President Cleveland's old home. Father Mackin, pastor of St. Paul's Catholic Church, emphatically denied the story set afloat that the Admiral had rented a pew in that church. He explained that Mrs. Dewey owned a pew in the church prior to her marriage. The church authorities thereupon changed the name on the pew from HAZEN to DEWEY, but this indicated only her ownership, and not her husband's.

NEW WAR DEVELOPMENT
