PATRIOTIC ACT.—"In order to cooperate with the Canada Food Board in its efforts to promote increased consumption of Atlantic fish," says a late food board report. "Messrs. Burke and Macbeth, of Alberton, P.E.I. recently diverted from New York Market 698 barrels of fresh mackerel to Toronto and 30 barrels to Montreal. This was done despite the fact that prices in the American market were higher than those in Canada."

## H. R. H. PRINCE ARTHUR INSPECTS P. E. I. H. B.

H. R. H. Prince Arthur of Connaught accompanied by Major General Lissard G. O. C. M. D. No. 6, and other Officers made an inspection of the P. E. I. Island battery at Fort Ives Saturday Aug. 24th at 2.30 P. M. He watched the men in Gun Drill and also in the carrying out of "First Aid" and was very much pleased with the way they conducted themselves. ## CHRISTMAS INFORMATION

Miss Rose Stanway, Auxiliary member of the Canadian Field Comforts Commission, has just received word from England in regard to the opening of the Christmas Fund in Canada to be sent forward to the Commission for purchasing gifts for our Canadian forces overseas. As previously arranged, the money for gramophones which are so urgently asked for by units in France, will be sent to the Commission as a special gift from this province. This fund is now open, and all contributions from throughout the province may be sent to Miss Stanway, 70 Prince street, to forward to the Commission to assist their magnificent work for Canadian soldiers.

A previous letter stated that the Commission was simply besieged with requests for gramophones which they could not supply for lack of funds for that particular purpose. The recent letter states: "We hope that the Gramophone Fund will appeal to all your people for they are in such great demand in France." An Envelope Day will also be held early in October. As the Commission is strictly a military organization, and has the approval of the British War Office in all its undertakings we heartily commend this Fund to all our people in Prince Edward Island.

Miss Stanway also has word to say that people in this province wishing to have Christmas parcels forwarded free may address them as follows: Miss Plummer, R. E. Barracks, Shorncliffe, England. Add to this address but on a tag which may be detached: C-o A. D. of S. & T. Shed No. 2.

Montreal Harbour, P. Q. The parcels must contain also on the INSIDE and OUTSIDE in one corner the full address of the soldier for whom they are intended. If parcels for different soldiers are sent, they should be placed in one box in separate parcels addressed to the ones for whom intended. Persons wishing to send such free, must ship by freight (not express) weight not to exceed 56 lbs. These packages should be sent this month to reach France in time for Christmas. Persons who wish to forward by express must pay their own charges but need not in that case ship comforts before October. Miss Plummer has often been blamed because parcels did not arrive in time, whereas it was wholly due to transportation facilities and the late date upon which the people here shipped their parcels. Any further information will gladly be furnished by Miss Stanway in order to help our people and our boys. Tomorrow will be published a list giving prices for assorted parcels which Miss Plummer will send to soldiers from their people at home on receipt of amount of cost of articles.
