Run By Liquid Air.

Novel Vehicle Attracting Attention at the New York Automobile Show—Few Vibrations and no Smell.

What appears to be the second edition of the Madison Square Automobile Show is going at the Grand Central Palace, and one of the features in the exhibition of the liquid air machine. The machine is practically a locomobile carriage, with liquid air storage cylinders, substituted for the boiler and water naphtha tanks of the locomobile.

While the process of charging was going on at the first trial, says the New York Sun, many comments facetious and otherwise, were heard and several stung their fingers feeling the ice on the pipes. It took about 15 minutes to "get up steam," and when the machine really started to move there was loud hand-clapping. Every one wanted to ride in it and many were accommodated. A reporter of the Sun went several laps around the track, and found that there was little vibration, no smell and not the least bit of a puff from the exhaust. The distance the machine will run is stated variously. From seven to 30 miles has been stated by the exhibitors, but it is explained that a special engine must be built for it, and it will then run 50 miles. This "auto" was so much the feature of the night that a pursuit race scheduled was called off.

The 75-pound motor bicycle, which is the lightest yet seen, was tearing the track on Wednesday at a rate of speed greater than the Fire De; a timent officials allow the larger machines to travel when it came to grief by dashing into a post. The mishap was due to the rider's unfamiliarity with the coaster brake upon the machine. The operator was not hurt and the other damage was easily repaired.

A novelty offered by one of the new exhibitors is an electric carriage capable of traveling 85 miles without recharging. The objection commonly urged against electric is the difficulty of taking them far into the country, but the electrical makers seem to keep selling them.

Endless Naval Expansion.

France has passed a naval bill calling the enormous expenditure of \$150,000,000 in new warships. The new program will add to the French navy six first-class battleships or cruisers, five protected cruisers, twenty-nine torpedo boats, and forty-four submarine boats. This surpasses the increase contemplated by any other nation, and its natural effect will be to bring about a corresponding expansion in all the other navies of Europe. Germany and England will at once feel the need of more battleships and torpedo boats. Russia will feel in duty bound to build more ships. The worst of it is no apparent end to this increase.

The endless chain arrangement is seen in the types of warships no less than in the size of the various navies. When one nation began building ironclads all the nations had to abandon wooden ships. When the torpedo boat made its appearance it at once called for the torpedo boat destroyer, and now each nation is called upon to maintain an increasing fleet of both types. Every year brings some improvement in order to maintain their jealously guarded balance of power. In this connection the most significant feature of the French naval program is the building of forty-four submarine boats. No other nation has such an underwater fleet. These submarines torpedo boats will be a menace to the largest battleship and cruiser. The step that France has taken calls for English and German fleets of submarine destroyer to cope with these new machines of war. There seems to be no practical way of stopping the endless chain and avoiding the burdens under which it is crushing the weaker nations of Europe, but no demonstration is needed to show that there are decided advantages in a policy of peace and of moderate armament such as the United States is happily able to maintain.

Vertical Writing.

Notwithstanding the adverse action of the New York school board, directing the teachers to revert to the slanting system of writing, the vertical method survives and has many friends. The Nelson (B.C.) Economist says:

The vertical system of writing adopted in the public schools of this province is now, after a fair trial, generally accepted as a great improvement on the old style, or that in vogue in other school systems throughout Canada. Vertical writing possesses all the advantages of legibility, and it has been demonstrated that the pen can be wielded as rapidly in forming the plan characters as when employed in making the peculiar hieroglyphics which to often are designated as a business hand, so markedly indecipherable had writing become that the typewriter from its first appearance on the market was hailed as a Godsend. Difficult of interpretation as is the ordinary writing, the larger publishing houses insist on having typewritten copy—illegible manuscript they will not accept under any circumstances. Life is too short to be wasted in a struggle with bad writing. But the vertical system taught in our schools is legibility itself. And it enjoys another advantage not to be despised—it does not injure the sight.
