MR. L. E. PROWSE, M. I. A.

It could not be otherwise than gratifying to Mr. L. E. Prowse, on the eve of his departure to Sydney, to meet so numerous and representative a body of his fellow citizens as were assembled in the Council Chamber yesterday afternoon. The address with which he was presented, and the kind and appreciative remarks of all who spoke are fairly expressive of the regard in which he is and has long been held. The business firm of which he has been the head is most widely and favorably known throughout the Island and far beyond its boundaries. That it has been so successful and so widely and favorably known is very largely due to the business ability, energy and uniform courtesy which at all times have been characteristic of its senior partner.

THE GUARDIAN joins very heartily in the general regret that is felt in connection with Mr. Prowse's removal. The city loses one of its foremost and most energetic business men, a good citizen, a genial companion and a popular representative. The poor will miss a warm-hearted friend whose hand was ever open to supply their needs. The Liberal party is distinctly weakened by the withdrawal of one who stood so high in public favor. It is gratifying to know that Mr. Prowse will still retain an interest in the old firm here, and we are sure he will always remain strongly attached to the city in which he rose from the ranks to have so large a place in our commercial and political affairs. We doubt not that the qualities which ensured for him so great a share of success in business and of public favor generally in Prince Edward Island, will speedily win for Mr. Prowse a large place in the mercantile business of Sydney and all the prominence he desires in its social, civic and political concerns.

THE GUARDIAN learns that Sir Charles Tupper and Hon. Dr. Foster will visit Charlottetown and address a mass meeting of the electors on Tuesday, September 4th. The venerable Leader of the Opposition and his first lieutenant are both mighty men of renown in party warfare and no doubt the electors of both parties will avail themselves of the opportunity to hear what they have to say. We expect to see a very large meeting, with great enthusiasm in the Conservative ranks. No doubt we shall hear the best that can be said for the old party on that occasion.
