DEATH OF MISS PROFITT, R.N.—The death occurred at the P. E. Island Hospital Friday night of Miss Mamie Profitt, a trained nurse under particularly sad circumstances. AT ST. JAMES' CHURCH.—At St. James' Church yesterday Principal Fraser, of the Montreal Presbyterian College preached two very able sermons. In the evening he spoke on the significance of the song of Israel: 'Spring up, O Well; sing ye unto it,' a beautiful little lyric found in the book of Numbers. To the oriental mind the well was the symbol of abject toil and the song illustrated the genius of the Hebrew people, who reached a religion which made the humblest duty a joy. The speaker went on to show that the life of Christ, though full of routine and labor, was full also of inspiration and idealism. His whole life, like Nature, was one of repose in action. The sacrament of eating and drinking in remembrance of Him, was symbolic of His elevation and consecration of the commonest things of life.
