Why King's Should Be Supported

Far too many people throughout the Provinces seem to have forgotten that Kings College was destroyed by fire a year ago, and as yet little has been done towards the rebuilding of the institution. True the foundation has been partly laid, but even the work on that has been impeded for need of necessary funds. That dearly beloved and most useful seat of learning, which stood the storms of nearly a century and a half is now threatened with extinction, and its pleading for support and assistance from the ones it has so nobly served for many generations.

A person need only reflect for a moment upon the history of this ancient University in order to realize its value to education and civilization in general. It was when the Imperial Red Coats marched against the American Colonists and the latter severed their connection with the Motherland that the fathers of Kings came to Windsor, and became subjects of a foreign state. It was principles like these that Kings has instilled upon all students connected with her during one hundred and thirty years of training. Space will not permit me to go into historical details, but a glance at the names of famous men who claim Kings as their Alma Mater will testify to the quality of her instructions. Kings probably did not have such grand buildings as some other Universities possess but it must be borne in mind that brick and stone do not constitute the grand colleges. These are merely necessary instrumentalities. The ideal college must be judged by its faculty, avowal of training, and its traditions. These Kings possesses, second to none in Canada.

Let us reflect for a moment on the necessity of maintaining our Universities. The function of a University is to educate. All education whether primary, secondary or specialized has three basic purposes, the constituency which it serves, and the organization which it carries on. All these three are essential for the upkeep and advancement of civilization. Nature endows us with a certain innate and a potentiality for development and knowledge. The University serves this purpose. It takes the student to her classes untried in a common clay—teaches them to abide or inhibit their instincts and sends them out in the world hardened into the bone and sinew of manhood. This is an indispensable necessity. When they close their station sets in; then follows a retrograde movement intellectually. This is one of the saddest and most serious things which can seize upon mankind. There never was a time in history of the world when there was a greater call for men and women of education and thus good judgment. We see about us the folly of having untrained minds meddling with the affairs of state, church and mankind in general, which they are not capable of managing. This is to a great extent the cause of the social unrest.

Kings' College is indispensable for several reasons. It is the Ang-

lican School of Divinity for the Maritime Provinces, which will be non-political, it is expected says a Gazette writer, that several important announcements on the national question confronting the Dominion will be made together with intimation of the plans being prepared by the Government to meet them.
