SINGLE MEN MORE LIABLE TO INSANITY.

LONDON, Aug. 27.—The question whether single men are more liable to insanity than married men was raised at a meeting of the Cardiff Board of Guardians.

A male lunatic attendant applied for permission to get married and live out, but the Visiting Committee could not recommend the Board to accede to his request.

A member objected to the committee's decision because it put a "premium on single bliss." (laughter).

Dr. Sixsmith said that statistics proved that single men were much more liable to insanity than married men. It was a "catching disease," too. (laughter.) The best thing to do was to let the man get married.

EXCAVATION WORK ON PANAMA CANAL

WASHINGTON, Aug. 27.—The figures showing the amount of excavation to be done on the Panama Canal indicate the work was five-sixths finished on August first, but there actually remained 6,903,000 cubic yard more earth to be removed than had been estimated for a year before.

This apparent backward movement is explained in the official record by a large amount of siltage in the canal bed which must be removed from the finished tunnels, and also by the necessity for extensive excavation for dry docks, coaling stations, and terminals at Balboa, which were not taken into account.

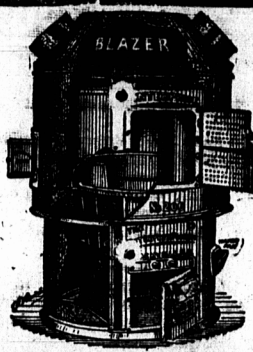
