REV. A. E. BURKE'S ADDRESS.

(Continued from the First Page.)

flourishing plantations, things of beauty and sources of profit. On this point I cannot do better than quote the excellent agricultural authority the Maritime Farmer. (Father Burke is read from an editorial article in The Farmer on the Paternal Visit as a Force in Teaching.)

Under the stimulus of this wonderfully successful mission which we owe with so many other things to Prof. Robertson, the greatest activity in all branches of horticulture has been awakened, thousands and thousands of trees have gone into the ground under conditions which secure successful growth; thousands more of useful and undesirable stock from a commercial point of view, have been brought to standard varieties; old neglected orchards have been renewed, and a spirit of emulation excited as to the proper tending of plantations previously receiving only a measure of care.

In sending Messrs. Yroom and Burke to us Prof. Robertson wrote me on April 12th: "I hope your Association will not expect too much to be accomplished in the first year, but I hope that we shall get on right lines so that what is done this year will pave the way to a great improvement and extension of the fruit-growing interests on the Island."

Despite the cold, damp and backward season our orchardists called the past year a fairly successful one. The apple crop may be placed at 65 per cent of a full crop; stone fruits were below the average.

I am happy to be able to state that the relations during the past year between this Association and the Department of Agriculture here have been most cordial. We have received our small grant—O (that it were quadrupled) promptly and the Commissioner has contributed to the printing of our report as well as accorded us numerous little favors and privileges.

I regret to say that the new Secretary of the F. G. A. of Ontario has positively refused to continue the terms made with the old as to the Horticulturist. We paid 50 cents of our annual fee for the Horticulturist and received with it the F. G. Report of Ontario, the latter being highly regarded as of great value to the fruit growers.

We have not advanced the price of our tobaccos. Amber smoking tobacco, Bobs, chewing tobaccos are the same size and price to the consumer as formerly. We have also extended the time for the redemption of Snowshoe Tags to January 1st.

alone. In view of our restricted finances I cannot advise the acceptance of the new terms, and you will be called upon to say what course we are to pursue as to a regular horticultural publication.

Yielding to the importunities of the different agricultural associations among which our voice was raised with no uncertain sound, the Provincial Government made a reasonable grant to the Exhibition Company last year and a show which merited the commendation of strangers and Islanders alike was held on their grounds in September.

To outsiders the show was really astounding and if there remained one man who hugged the old delusion that man must have gone away in despair. Although the season was early and many of the varieties were immature, the exhibit of apples and plums was the largest and most magnificent ever seen here and far superior to that of Halifax and St. John.

With the facilities for comparison of the different varieties of fruit which the exhibition afforded and the great knowledge and experience of Judges Starr and the many other specialists available it was thought well to commence the very necessary work of a revision of the list together too extensive a prize list with a view to the encouragement of useful sorts of fruit and the elimination of worthless ones.
