Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

The sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

SUBSTITUTING LEATHER

(Canadian Press Despatch.) WASHINGTON.—The department of commerce has contributed a good deal already to the government's war conservation programme, according to a statement made by Secretary Redfield. One of the most important problems before the department, the secretary of commerce said, is that of developing leather substitutes.

The department is conducting experiments through the specialists of the bureau of standards and fisheries, he stated, "for the tanning of shark hides, porpoise, grayfish, and grouper, with a view to making them commercially available. Some very fine leather is made from some of these fish hides, and if we are successful in this it will mean much to the people who must be shod, and will tend to bring the prices of footwear downward."

The bureau of standards has discovered the process by which the Germans have been making chemical porcelain, without which the laboratories and chemists would be seriously handicapped. That porcelain is now being produced commercially in the United States, rendering us independent of foreign markets.

TEACHERS AT MURRAY RIVER

The South King's Teachers' Association held its second meeting in the hall at Murray River on Friday, June 1st. The meeting opened at 2 o'clock. The President, Principal Shaw, presided, and A. L. McLean acted as secretary pro tem.

In his opening remarks Mr. Shaw referred to the plan of holding three meetings instead of one; to the successful meeting at Souris; and to the one to be held at Montague on Friday next; to the death of the Teachers' Magazine and to the effect of the present war on our schools.

Inspector Adams suggested that this association be named the Southern Branch of the Eastern Teachers' Association, and that five members be on its executive. He encouraged the reading of books to a certain extent, the teachers to take responsibility of the pupils, visit homes, advise and encourage pupils and parents.

The evening session opened at 9 p. m., and was largely attended. Robert Whitney, Jr., in the chair, made an eloquent tribute to our educationists.

The address of Dr. Robertson, re-education, was a treat, as well as was also that of Judge Fitzgerald on National Service, and Prof. McLarty on Rural Science. Rev. A. Sutherland in the absence of Hon. M. McKinnon spoke briefly on Education and the Church.

The meetings closed by singing the National Anthem.
