He asked them to be loyal, not to surrender and to fear God. He assured them that they could not afford to go to the front and not to personal allegiance to the King of Kings.

He further spoke of the darker phase of our National life and urged the boys to be true. Reference was made by the speaker of the dark condition which befell Belgium under German supremacy and urged that all do their part to enable us to continue our enjoyment of our Freedom.

An inspiring sight was the appearance of our boys in khaki seated on the platform.

It was moved by Rev. D. McLean and Sec. by Rev. A. A. Gates that a vote of thanks be tendered the members of Hamilton Lodge and the Ladies, for their kindness in giving the splendid evening's enjoyment.

The evening closed with the singing of the National Anthem and three cheers for our brave Soldier Boys.

150TH OF MONTREAL GOES TO AMHERST

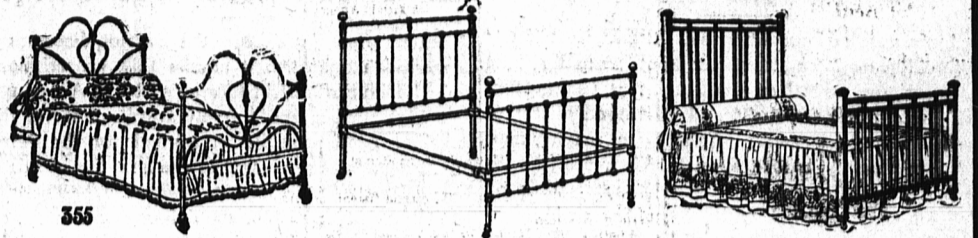
