Arrested for Fas: Driving.

Boston, July 21.—Willie K. Vanderbilt, Jr., the owner of millions and a fast French automobile, was arrested yesterday by the Metropolitan Park police in Milton for running his machine a good deal faster than our law permits.

Mr. Vanderbilt left his stable at Newport at 6.33 yesterday and arrived in Boston shortly before 9 o'clock, making the run of 2 miles in two hours and 18 minutes, at a rate of speed averaging 31.3 miles an hour or a mile in less than two minutes.

WINNIPEG, JULY 2.—The Department of Agriculture is now receiving the usual July crop reports from various quarters of the Province, and when spoken to on the subject Hon. Mr. Davidson, Minister of Agriculture, said they were not at all encouraging so far.

would not average seven or eight bushels to the acre. Other reports were scarcely more encouraging, and one man predicted an average crop of five bushels per acre in his district. "There is no doubt," says Mr. Davidson, "that the crop is not improved as much as had been hoped for, and I do not expect to see more than five bushels of an average on the acreage of the Province. There is no use disguising the fact, as it only works harm to many farmers, who will have to ask their creditors to wait for another year. If these creditors understand the true position of affairs they will not be so imperative in their demands. There is no doubt, however, but that this year's temporary failure will result in a redoubled crop next year, as the land will get rest, and thousands of acres will be given an extra coat of manure by summer fallowing. With favorable conditions next year a double crop is almost assured."

Russia's Asiatic possessions are three times the size of Great Britain's, but hold only 23,000,000 inhabitants, as compared with England's 297,000,000 subjects.

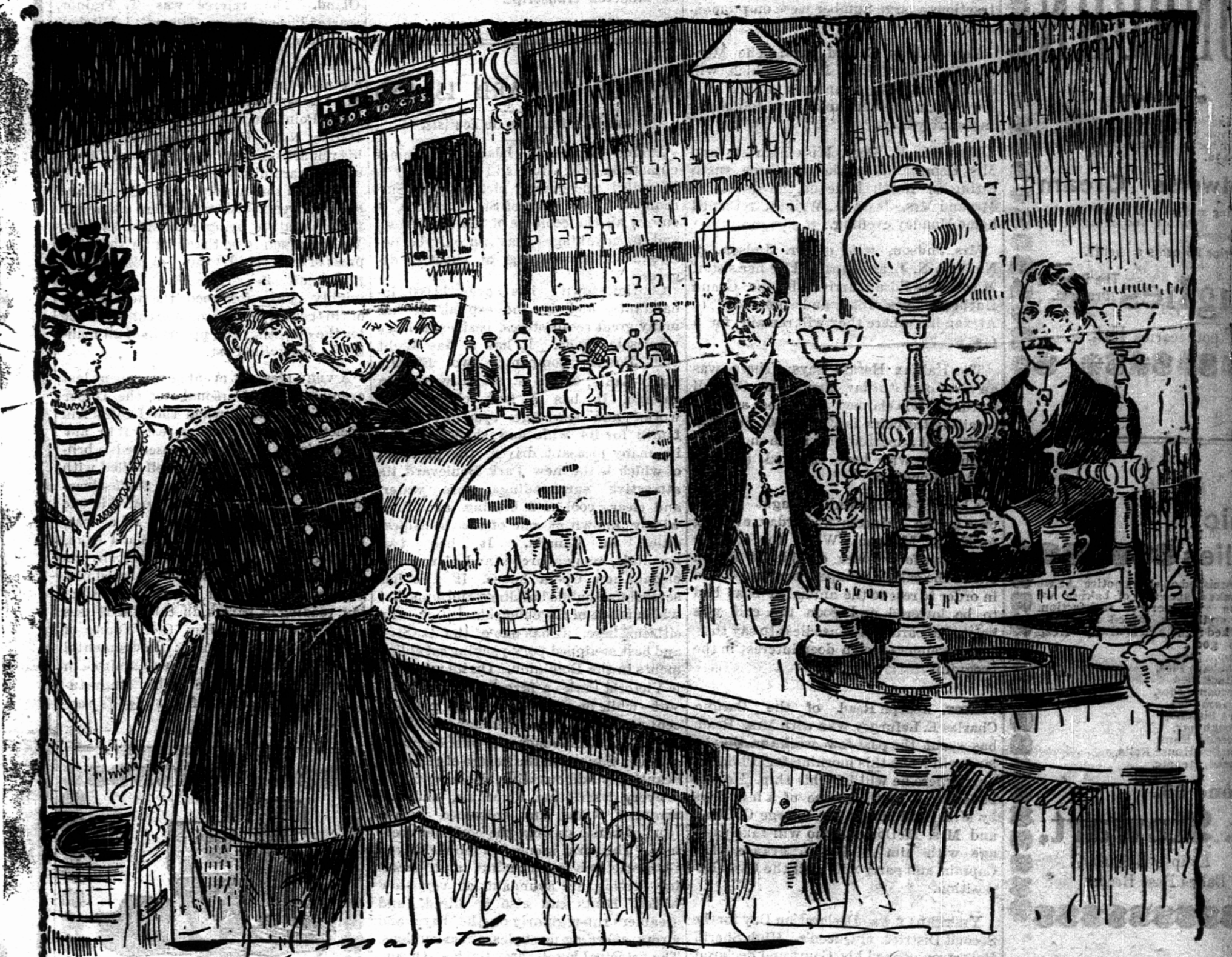
