MEXICO CITY, Mexico, April 15 (Special)—That the withholding of official recognition by the United Dominion Government on Saturday States has materially weakened the Huerta government is the opinion generally expressed by the public and privately admitted in certain Mexican official circles. The new rebel government has made greater progress than has the provisional government in opposing the insurrection, and it is no longer a secret that the condition of the treasury is such as will not permit much longer a continuation of military operations. This has been publicly admitted by the Mexican Minister of the interior, Garcia Granados.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 15 (Special)—Those who expect a Japanese war cloud to form if California enacts an alien land law overlooks the fact that Japan now withholds from American citizens the same right of land ownership that the California Legislature proposes to deny to Japan. The Japanese law relating to the rights of foreigners to own land was published in the Official Gazette at Tokyo, on April 13, 1910, but the imperial edict necessary for the operation of the law has not been issued.

LONDON, April 16 (Special)—The Daily News, referring to Mr. Bryan's speech to the Ambassadors at the Navy League dinner, says: "The time has come by, we fear, when expenditure on armaments will be diminished by any such protests as Mr. Bryan threatens to address to Mr. Daniels. That will only happen when the nations, settling into barbarism, realize fully that armaments are fostered by policy and that the policy of suspicion and aggression in which Europe has indulged for generations, is too heavy a burden to be borne."
