The wheat crop is expected to fall 55 per cent below pre-war levels, and existing bread rationing through the country is being aggravated by the lack of potatoes and fodder crops.

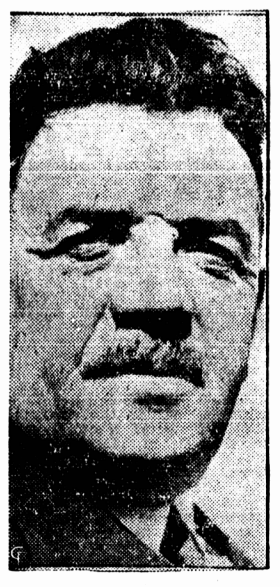
Former Sydney Fire Chief Passes Away
