HOW CAN I !!!

Q. How can I clean chamomiles?

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ON PRICE CONTROL

Q. How do I apply for ration cards for my seasonal farm help?

A. You apply in person or write to your local ration board for form R-171A for transient farm labor. You complete this, return it to the ration board and you will receive documents entitling you to the permitted ration.

Q. How much sugar is allowed for breweries and distilleries in Canada?

A. No sugar is used by brewing and distilling industries in this country.

Q. Before going overseas my son and his family lived in a house I own. He has been discharged and would like to rent the same house now occupied by other tenants. How long a notice to vacate must I give the present occupants?

A. After your son is discharged you give the tenants a three month's notice to vacate. The notice must be on a form provided by the Board. Your son must occupy the accommodation for a period of one year from the time the notice is given, unless the tenant is required to vacate.

Apropos of the mace—if you use this spice in the form of liquid extract, use only very few drops and add 1/2 to the milk instead of to the dry ingredients as is done with the dry ground mace. A mace extract is more potent in flavor so add 1/2 drop by drop.
