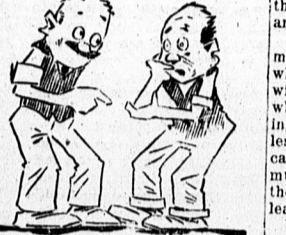

GINGER WINE, ANOTHER WAY

Allow 25 lbs. moist sugar to nine gallons of water, add 18 lemons and 6 ozs. ginger. Take off the fire, and strain through a cloth.

MAY BLOSSOM CORDIAL

Try to choose the may blossoms on a dry still day when there is no dust blowing. Gather as many full-blown flowers as will fill a large wine-bottle.

RED POPPY CORDIAL (Swift Water.)

Take 3 red poppies that grow among the corn and put them into one gallon of brandy. Steep two days and nights and then wring them out and put the water (I suppose the water means the liquor) into a glass, then put to it 1 lb. fine sugar, 2 lbs. raisins, of the sun-dried variety, 2 ozs. of the best liquorish scraped and sliced, 1 oz. of bruised aniseed, 1 oz. of Nettle-seed, or Venice treacle, 1/2 oz. of saffron dried and rubbed, 1 pint of cowslip water, 1/2 oz. long pepper, bruised, 1/2 oz. Virginia snake root, 1/2 oz. of cardamoms; "Put them altogether in the glass and set in the sun for 3 weeks. Shake it once a day, then strain it for use."
