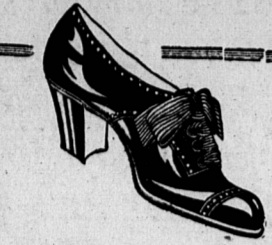

The band concert tomorrow, Thursday evening, will be held in the gardens instead of at the Park as formerly. This will be greatly appreciated by the Charlottetown citizens.

J. S. Clayton of the C. P. R. station, Fredericton, N. B., and Mrs. Clayton, left last week on a three week vacation trip to points in Prince Edward Island and will also go through the Annapolis Valley.

Miss Ella M. Palmer, of Roxbury, Mass, daughter of James E. Palmer, of Minnington, will arrive home on July 29th and will make a short visit of two weeks at her old home, returning to Boston on August 12th instant.

Rev. A. B. MacLeod has tendered his resignation to the congregation of St. John's Church, Cornwall, Ontario. His health has obliged him to give up work. Mr. MacLeod is a native of Springfield, P. E. I. -Moncton Transcript.

Rev. S. Howard, B.D., Sackville, N. B., formerly of this Province, was tendered a public reception in the basement of the church recently. A most enjoyable evening was spent. Addresses were delivered by Dr. Allison, Inch and Sprague, the Rev. Mr. Dickie (Presbyterian), and Rev. Mr. Cann (Baptist).

The following will be of interest here as Rev. Mr. McLaughlin is a native of this Province and several teachers are in attendance at the Summer School from this Province. Muscular christianity was vigorously and eloquently upheld by Rev. Neil MacLaughlin, in a sermon to the summer school of science this evening. He praised physical drill, which teachers are undergoing and predicted results of utmost benefit to the rising generation. He described life as a struggle in which the fittest win prizes. Churches have used too much ice cream and soda at attractions. They should rather attract men and women as Garibaldi attracted his soldiers. He promised that churches must attract by promise of achievement and possibility of great achievement. The pulpit of the Methodist church was occupied in the morning by J. D. Seaman, the foremost local preacher of the Prince Edward Island conference. He preached eloquently on the power of sympathy.

Late Brandon papers give extended reports of the big rifle shoot held there last week. This shoot was largely attended by riflemen from both Manitoba and Saskatchewan, including several of the noted crack shots from Winnipeg. A summary of these reports shows that J. E. Matthews, formerly of Charlottetown, was close to the top in every match except one, while in the grand aggregate—the real test—his name occupied a prominent place among the leaders. In both the Lieutenant-Governor of Saskatchewan's match and the Coldwill match he missed by only one point, winning the first prize silverware. He also led the Brandon city team which shot off in the Western Rifle League, against four other picked teams of the West. As a result of his steady marksmanship he had the distinction of being selected as one of a team of six men to represent Western Manitoba in an inter-provincial match. Mr. Matthews' hosts of friends in this Province will be glad to learn that he so ably upheld the reputation of P. E. Island riflemen when pitted against the best sharp shooters of the West.

There was a fair attendance at the Charlottetown market yesterday and not much change in prices excepting in raspberries and strawberries. The people bought largely of blueberries, black currants, new potatoes, cabbage, peas, and gooseberries which were brought to the market for about the first time this season. There is an itemized statement given elsewhere in this issue.

The following market prices from Halifax will prove interesting here as from time to time the Guardian is asked for same. Potatoes are now a dear article and those who are fortunate enough to have a good supply will reap a good harvest. In green market Saturday morning new potatoes sold for \$2.00 a bushel. This price is much higher than that asked at about the same time last year. This week a slight drop in the price is expected. The heavy demand for new potatoes is given as the reason for the high price. Cauliflowers brought ten to fifteen to twenty cents a head; beets, forty cents a dozen bunches, or five cents a single bunch; peas, late, 15 cents; early, five cents a quart more.
