IN MEMORIAM

THE PASSING OF MR. D. A. SMITH

The death of D. A. Smith, which took place in Harbor View hospital, Sydney Mines, this morning at 7 o'clock, and particularly under such sad and tragic circumstances, has created a universal feeling of profound regret such as has not in many years been experienced throughout Cape Breton, and particularly in North Sydney, where the deceased had for nearly half a century been an outstanding and respected citizen.

Particulars of his untimely death may be briefly told. He boarded the one o'clock tram car leaving North Sydney yesterday afternoon for Sydney Mines, where he intended in his capacity of official coal inspector to pay an official visit. Alighting from the tram car at Sydney Mines he walked down the tracks of the Scotia yard, as had been his custom ever since being appointed to the position several years ago. In some way or another, the facts of which will likely be brought out at the inquest tonight, he was struck by a Scotia locomotive and sustained besides other injuries a compound fracture of the skull.

Tender hands and sorrowing hearts quickly hastened to the aid of the aged victim, who was unconscious, when he was hastened to the hospital, but despite every effort Mr. Smith never regained consciousness and passed into the hands of his Maker this morning about sixteen hours after the accident.

Mr. Smith was born in Charlottetown nearly 85 years ago, and came of a race of Englishmen whose identity was closely linked with the nobility of England. The writer, then as a boy remembered Mr. Smith when the latter was allied in business undertakings with other old English stock, such as the Swabeyes, Breckons, Hyndmans, Popes, Palmers, Jenkins and others of the English nobility who settled in Prince Edward Island's capital, governing the Garden of the Gulf.

After leaving the Island, Mr. Smith went to St. John, N. B. where he conducted a most successful ship brokerage and insurance business. About 45 years ago he saw the great possibilities Cape Breton offered in his business, and ever since then he has been an active figure in the welfare of the place. Years ago he was always a leader in anything and everything pertaining to the uplift of the community. As a church worker there was none ever better in St. John's Anglican, of which he has since the inception of the church here been deacon.

In a word Mr. Smith was a fine example of the real English country gentleman—more could not be said of a departed friend.

Mr. Smith was married to Miss Britain, who predeceased him years ago, without issue. His only near relatives is an unmarried sister, a few years his senior, who resides at Digby. A brother for years lived in New Zealand, but is believed to be dead. Three or four nephews, and nieces live in the States, and his mother-in-law, Mrs. Britain, and daughter reside in New York, but countless are the sorrowing friends who will as long as life lasts cherish his memory.—North Sydney Herald.

Mr. Smith referred to above was a son of the late Mr. John Spencer Smith of Charlottetown. Mrs. Lewis C. Wright, 98 Kent street is a niece of the deceased and messrs. William Sydney Smith and Douglas Smith, formerly of this city and of St. John N. B. are nephews. Besides the relatives above mentioned two brothers predeceased him, namely William Sydney Smith Charlottetown, and Rev. R. E. Smith, Rector of St. George N. B. for many years. To the bereaved relatives the heartfelt sympathy of their many friends goes out in their sudden bereavement.
