Scots Guards Make Great 28-Day Trek

LONDON, July 8 (Thursday) — (CP) — A great 28-day, 2,800-mile trek by a battalion of Scots Guards from Syria to the Marek Line was disclosed today by the War Office. The Guards travelled by motor transport with other units and lost seven or eight of their hundreds of vehicles en route. They arrived in Tunisia in time to play a leading role in the successful Mendenline battle on March 6, the War Office said.

No Results Yet In So. African Election

JOHANNESBURG, July 7 (CP) — South Africa's 1,250,000 civilian voters went to the polls here today to help settle one big issue—whether to continue the war as they have been fighting it, for the last four years, or whether to return to opposition-pledged neutrality. The opposition is advocating a republican form of government and an end of the British connection.

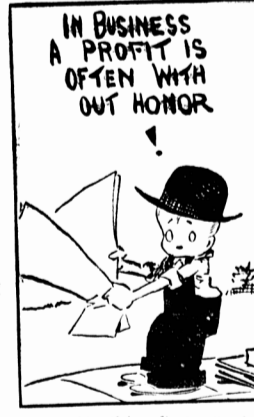
