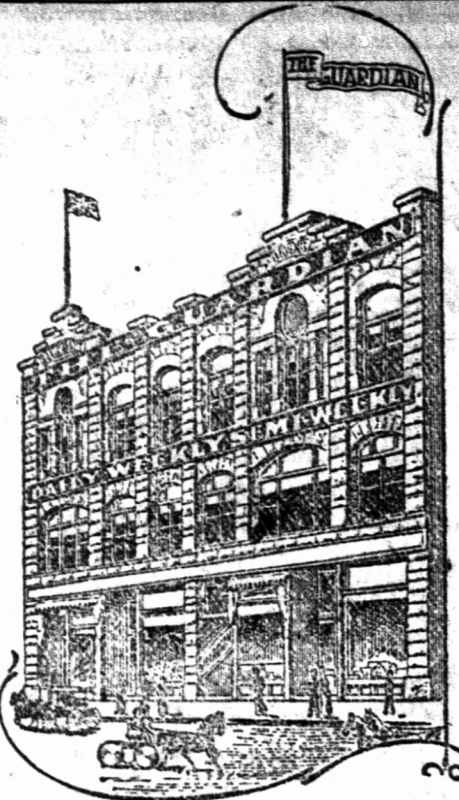

BRITISH P. O. SAVINGS BANKS.

The British post office savings bank system is one of the successful financial institutions of the country. One person in every five of the population of the United Kingdom is a depositor, so that if they were evenly distributed every family of the British Isles would be represented in the concern. The savings bank pays only 2 1/2 per cent interest on deposits, at which rate the pound earns about a half penny per month. No more than £50 will be received from any depositor in a year, and no single account is allowed to exceed £200. This latter amount is seldom reached, not more than 10 per cent of the depositors having the maximum amount on deposit. The average among the 8,500,000 depositors is a trifle over £16.

There are nearly 14,000 branches of the bank in the United Kingdom at any one of which money may be deposited or withdrawn. The largest amount ever deposited in a single day was £458,115 and the largest amount ever withdrawn in one day was £221,149, or less than half as much as the maximum deposits in one day. Much larger sums are usually withdrawn at a time than are deposited at a time by the average depositor. They put in their money in small sums but when

it comes to withdrawal a considerable sum is usually taken out. The bank receives deposits as small as a shilling, but interest is paid only on completed pounds. There is also another feature which encourages people in poor circumstances to save their money, similar to the manner in which the French peasants are encouraged to invest their money in small amounts in the government securities.

Through the post office banks any one may purchase a shilling's worth of consols, and in this way have the nation also for his debtor, with the same absolute security for his investment as if the money were simply deposited in the government savings bank. On the request of a depositor the bank will buy for him any value of consols up to the value which he is permitted to have on deposit. Further it will allow a depositor to hold consols to the value of £500 through its office. Thus the individual depositor may have £200 on deposit and £500 more in consols, making £700 drawing interest from the bank. Each member of a family having a like privilege, it will be seen that a family of five might have £3,500 or about \$17,000 in control of the post office savings bank.

The people of Canada have over \$56,000,000 loaned to the Government through the savings banks in the dominion. This is equal to nearly \$11 per head or \$55 per family. It will be seen that with an average of nearly \$80 per family which the people of the British Islands have on deposit in the postal savings banks, they are making considerably more use of these institutions than the Canadian people are. The general rate of interest in Britain is lower than in Canada, and the opportunities for securing better returns here in other ways no doubt prevent the government savings banks being so extensively patronised as they would otherwise be. Both the British and Canadian savings banks are excellently managed and have the advantage of affording to depositors the best possible security.

The new battleship Maine has had her trial trip and has proved to be a much faster and more formidable ship than the first Maine, destroyed in Havana harbor. She is twice the size and has a speed of 18 knots.

Some very old Chinese guns have been sent to Ottawa as trophies of the late war in China. The Ottawa Citizen says they date back to the eleventh century, which is considerably before the European nations had a knowledge of gunpowder.

France has a great big school question on hand. She also has Sir Wilfrid Laurier on hand, and he has some reputation for settling school questions by "sunny ways." Perhaps the Canadian Premier may be induced to assist.

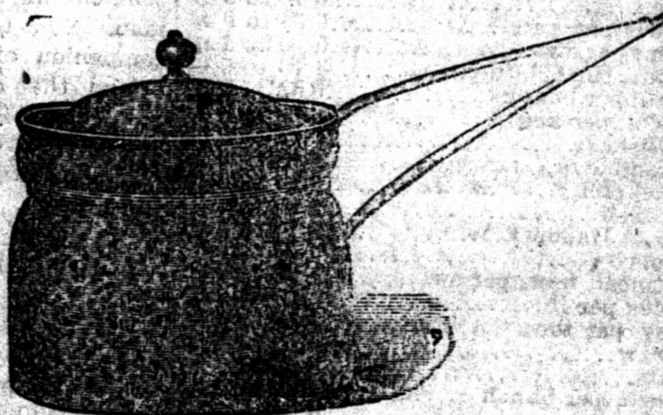
