TORONTO, April 29—(CP)—The mining stocks crowded into the spot light in today's stock exchange and both groups advanced strongly in the afternoon period, helped by the stronger sentiment of the New York board. The golds led the advance, posting an index gain of 1.18 while the base metals firmed. 39 and western oils held even in the average.

Senior golds made the chief contribution to the index gain. Dome advanced 1-8 to 11 3/4, Hollinger 49 to 7 1/2, Lake Shore 20 to \$7, Lamaque 30 to 3 1/2 and Buffalo Akerite 10 to 1.01. Other golds showing gains of 5 to 8 cents were East Malartic, Kerr Addison, Preston and Sylvanite and gains of 10 cents came out for Malartic Gold Fields and Wright Hargreaves. A Delnie and Sheep Creek, closed lower.

Trading was comparatively light in base metals and gains were limited to 1-4 to 1-2 point for International Nickel, Hudson Bay and Noranda. Consolidated Smelters held unchanged. Pend Oreille firmed 2 to 1.20 and Noranda was down a cent or two. Ontario Nickel traded in heavy volume and weakened a cent to 12 1-2. Steep Rock held unchanged.

Calgary-Edmonton was sold for a loss of 6 cents to 80. British-Dominion was down a cent to 22 and stronger were Home Oil and Anglo-Canadian.

NEW YORK, April 29—(AP)—The stock market rallied briskly in all departments today after a somewhat hesitant start which reflected uncertainty as to how business and financial circles would accept the government's sweeping price-freezing orders.

Stout covering and a moderate amount of new buying was enough to turn the tide and at the close the market was ahead 1 3/4 points to a point with a sprinkling up 2 or more.

Canadian stocks were strong. Dome gained 7 1/2, Walkers and International Nickel 3-8, McIntyre 5-8 and Canadian Pacific and Walkers pd. 1-8 each. Unchanged were Exarion, Traccon, Ford of Canada A, Hollinger and Imperial Oil.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite recorded a rise of .5 of a point, its best since March 17. The measure closed at 32.5 against yesterday's nine year low of 32.0. Transactions totaled 412,858 shares compared with 312,794 the day before.

American Telephone reversed trends after setting a new 7-year high at the start. It closed 2 1/8 higher. Phillip Morris climbed 1-2 and Westinghouse 1 7-8. DuPont, up more than 3 at one time, finished with a net gain of 1 3/4. Santa Fe was the best of the higher rail group, closing 1 1-2 to the good.

Food Production

Further encouragement of food production in the Union by the provision of necessary additional funds for the Food Controller is made in a financial bill which Finance Minister J. H. Hofmeyr introduced in the House of Assembly April 13.

Announcement was made in the Senate by Hon. Z. Shikwaza, minister of commerce and industries, that restrictions on sugar production in Natal had been lifted for the duration of the war.

New South African tea rationing regulations provide that no person may supply a dealer or from resale during any month more than 75 per cent of the average monthly quantity supplied by such person during the six months ended Feb. 28, 1942.

Rubber Loss Heavy

According to opinions expressed in government circles the Japanese occupation of Java robbed the Union government of £1,800,000, 046,000 worth of immediate rubber supplies.

As a civilian protective conference held in Cape Town it was decided to urge Hon. H. G. Lawrence, minister of the interior, to set up a civilian protective services advisory council made up of representatives of the navy, army and air services and other competent authorities.

TREATING SCRATCHES ON YOUR FURNITURE

If your furniture becomes badly scratched, better, if possible, get an expert to do the reconditioning job. However, a light scratch can often be made less noticeable by painting with mercurchrome or iodine, whichever would be the better match. Let dry and then wax carefully. For a deep scratch and if you have a more professional touch, try this: Dampen a cloth pad in alcohol and rub it crosswise over the scratch. Soften a shellac stick over a match and work with flexible knife blade. Smooth off with very fine sandpaper and then wax.
