SENT UP TO SUPREME COURT.—George and Alfred Lund and Harvey Manderson, appeared at the Police Court yesterday morning charged with assaulting members of the Police Force in the discharge of their duty. Officer A. McInnis, Sergt. Taylor and Marshal Cameron were the principal witnesses, testifying that the defendants were intoxicated on the night in question using bad language, acting in a disorderly manner and had assaulted the police. In the case of Manderson an additional witness was Mr. J. P. McCloskey who testified that an intoxicated man entered his store on Queen Street, near Kent, about 9.30 Saturday night, swearing and flourishing his arms and demanding a revolver threatening to kill witness if it was not forthcoming. Mr. McCloskey's lady clerk made her escape from the store by a side door and Mr. McCloskey seeing he could not reason with the man in the condition he was in went out of the store, leaving the drunken man in sole charge and ran over to the Police Station which he found closed. He saw several men in uniform on the street and got two of them whom he thought to be military police to come and take the man out of his store. The drunken man was in civilian clothes and his face was covered with blood. Witness was of the opinion that the prisoner Manderson before him was the same man. Mr. G. S. Inman, K. C. watched the case for defendants. The Magistrate, after hearing the evidence remanded the prisoners to the Supreme Court.

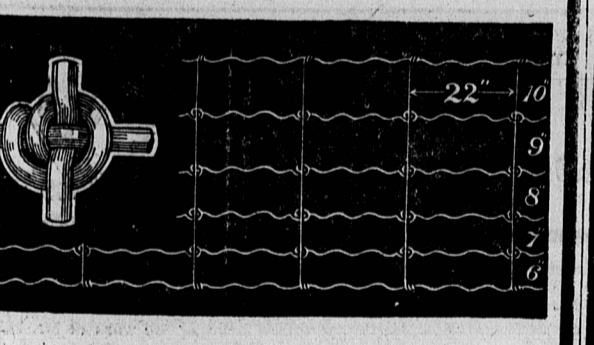
