Cook's Corner

ORANGE SOUFFLE

1/2 cup fine dry bread crumbs
1 cup milk
2 tablespoons butter
2 tablespoons shortening
Grated rind 1 orange
3 eggs, separated
2 tablespoons sugar
Dash of sugar.

Method: Combine the crumbs, milk, butter and shortening in the top part of a double boiler and add the grated orange rind. Cook this over boiling water for from 15 to 20 minutes, then beat with an egg beater until smooth.

Separate the eggs and beat the yolks until thick, then add the sugar and continue beating for 2 minutes longer. Add the bread and milk mixture, then fold in the beaten whites, stiff, and the salt added to them.

Pour the mixture into a 1-quart casserole or baking dish. Place this in a pan of hot water and bake in a moderate oven (350 deg. F.) for about 45 minutes. Serve immediately with any desired sauce.

GOOD FOODS CAN CAUSE SKIN DISTURBANCES

When an attack of hives occurs from time to time the patient is usually able to tell which food or foods is the cause. However, there are other skin disturbances due to foods—good, plain nourishing foods—that are not suspected as the cause. Thus, some cases of eczema can be traced directly to a certain food because every time the individual eats this food the skin eruption occurs. Thus, patients soon learn just what to eat or avoid in order to keep clear of skin disturbances and also stomach and intestinal upsets.

When a skin eruption occurs on the hands only, it is natural that the patient should suspect some substance he or she has been handling in the baking or bathing. That even where the hands only are affected food can be the cause is now well known. In the "Journal of Investigative Dermatology," Baltimore (skin diseases) Dr. J. M. Flood and D. J. Perry report 30 instances of peculiar dermatitis (tiny blisters) of the hands in 28 men between the ages of 21 and 39 years and in 2 women aged 24 and 28.

That allergy or sensitiveness to various foods was the cause was discovered in 29 of the 30 by putting them on a strict trial diet. The offending food was detected by having patient keep a food diary. Prompts improvement occurred as soon as the offending foods were withheld and definite reactions occurred when this offending food was again eaten.

The foods most likely to cause skin eruptions, stomach upsets and other reactions are such excellent and nourishing foods as wheat, milk, tuna fish, tomato, pork, pineapple, American cheese, eggs, lamb, chocolate, and chicken. The foods less likely to give a reaction are prunes, beef, cabbage, salmon, tea, pears and lemon.

Just why some foods cause skin and other disturbances in one and not in another is just one of those occurrences in Nature hard to understand. Allergy is the name given it, perhaps our most outstanding example being that
