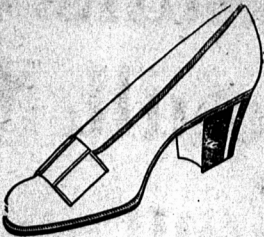

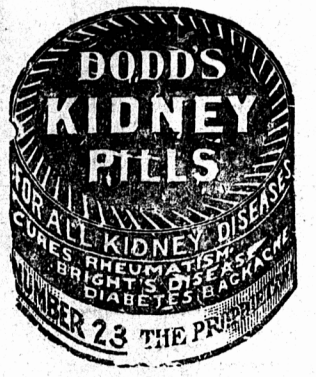
IT PAYS to buy in this Province.

BREEDER'S MEETING.—On Friday, June 20th, a meeting of the Dairy Cattle Breeder's Association was held in the Agricultural Hall, at which a Constitution was adopted and some lines of work that might be undertaken by the Association discussed. It is intended to keep a record of Pure Bred Dairy cattle owned by its members, and also a record of such Grade cattle as reach a certain standard. Advertising space will be taken in some of the Agricultural papers and all members having stock for sale will have the opportunity of using this space. It was also decided to encourage members of this Association to have their cattle tested for tuberculosis, and by way of encouragement the Association will make provision for having the test performed at a nominal fee. Any owner or breeder of Pure Bred Dairy cattle who has cows in the Record of Performance Test or any breeder who is a member of a Cow Testing Association and who breeds to Pure Bred Sires exclusively may become a member by paying the Annual Membership fee of one dollar.
