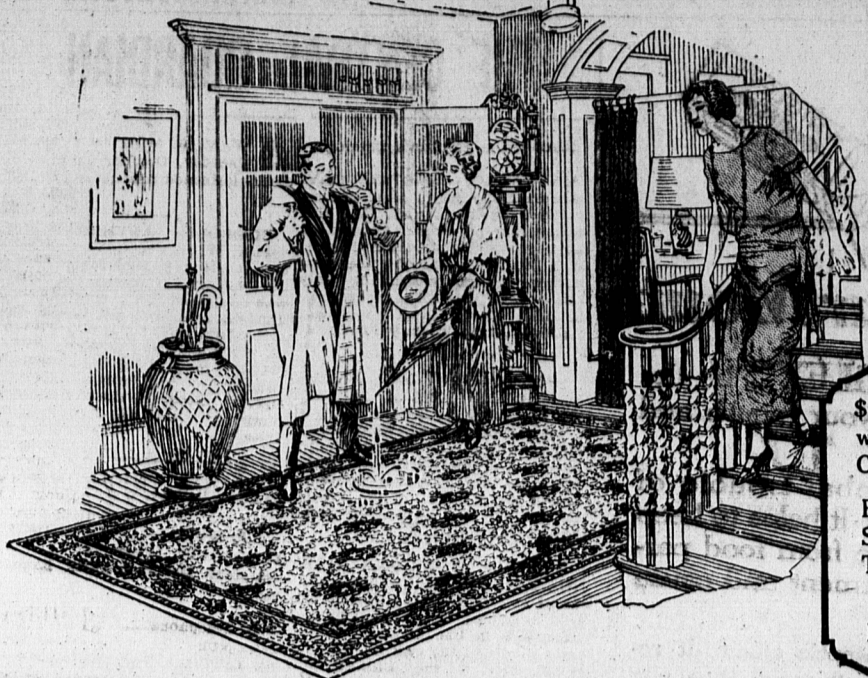

## Indian Friction Leads To Scene

SIMLA, Oct. 25.—Hindu-Muslim friction in India, which has during past months led to so many outbreaks of violence, today caused a scene at the reforms inquiry which is being conducted by Sir Alexander Muddiman's committee. Kabirud din Ahmed, who claims to represent three-quarters of the Assembly, made statements while giving evidence which roused communal feeling, and this led to a passionate outburst by Sir Tej Bahadur Sapru, who declared that Mr. Paranjpye and himself refused to notice the witness, his evidence, or his association in view of insulting remarks he had made to Sir Sivaswamy Aiyer. Sir Alexander Muddiman, who more than once has cautioned Mr. Kabirud Din to answer Sir Sivaswamy Aiyer's questions, asked what was the insult. Apparently restive under Sir Sivaswamy's deliberate but close examination, Kabirud Din said he refused to waste time answering unintelligent questions, muttering under his breath "a two rupee pleader." These words words caused a storm. Sir A Muddiman demanded their withdrawal, which was done, and the incident closed, but Sir Tej Sapru and Mr. Paranjpye still refused to examine the witness.

The main trend of Kabirud Din's evidence was a strong plea for caution in advance, as otherwise the interests of the Moslems would suffer. Kabirud Din declared that unless there was a change of heart among the people it would be im-

possible to secure Hindu-Muslim unity. If the British withdrew within four days there would be massacres.
