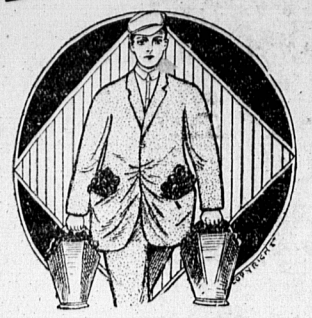

N. Gordon Douglas also of New York in three games of five, the scores being 15, 17, 15, 11, 11, 15, 9, 15, 15, and 13.

SEVERAL CHILDREN POISONED IN HOSPITAL.
NEW YORK, Feb. 23.—The mystery of the deaths of eight children, the oldest ten months, and the illness of four other infants, in the Brooklyn nursery and infants hospital since Sunday, was expected today to be solved by a chemical analysis of the contents of the stomachs of two of the dead children. An irritant poison believed to be oxalic acid mixed with lime water and milk was indicated by an autopsy to be the cause of death.
Coroner Physician Guest said that the evidence in the cases suggest, the theory of deliberate poisoning, perhaps by some hospital attendant afflicted with homicidal mania.

YOUNG BRITISH NOBLE TO WED GAILETY GIRL.
LONDON, Feb. 24.—The engagement of Lord Victor William Paget, brother and heir presumptive to the Marquis of Anglesea, to Miss Olive May, a popular Galety girl is announced. He is twenty-three years old, and his home is at Beau-desert Park, Rugby. Olive May is a daughter of Gordon A. May, who served in the federal army in the civil war, becoming a lieutenant-colonel. She was born in Chicago.

They eloped from Boston Tuesday evening and the ceremony was performed in Jersey City, N. J. Miss De Roche made her debut upon the stage in an act with Miss Della Finnegan of Dorchester only a few weeks ago, but has decided to abandon her career. Mrs. Boylan, formerly Miss De Roche, is at her home in Jamaica Plain, having returned there shortly after the marriage. Asked to confirm the report that she was married, Miss De Roche said: "Yes, it is true that I am married. Mr. Boylan and I were married in Jersey City, never mind by whom, and as soon as possible I shall go to either New York city or Troy, N. Y., which has been his home, to meet him. The engagement between the couple was of short duration. It was made late Tuesday afternoon and accepted. An agreement was proposed and accepted as well. That same evening Miss De Roche told her mother she was going to attend a show with a friend, but not the same theatre her mother went to. When the mother returned home her daughter was not there. The Johnston schoolhouse, Napan, was packed to the door, Tuesday night. Rev. J. M. MacLean and Rev. Geo. Wood had called the meeting and notified the Go preachers to attend. Mr. Wood read affidavits charging certain tramp preachers in Europe with spiriting young women away from home and other offences, and charged that the two Napan missionaries belonged to the same gang; and that one of them had been personally concerned in the disappearance of a P. E. Island girl. The accused admitted being in fellowship with the persons accused by the affidavits, but denied that there was any organization. They admitted knowledge of the island girl's disappearance, and said she was working as a preacher for the salvation of souls. The sentence lasted till midnight. The Chatham ministers held the tramp preachers down to the personal issue pretty closely, and declined to engage in a doctrinal debate with them. It is thought that the partisans of the Go preachers will still stick to them, but that the public in general will take warning by the facts that have been disclosed.—St. John exc.
