**DAVID RUSSELL SUES PINKERTON'S**

Nanama, the local manager of this agency.  
Mr. Russell has been working since last October on a case which had its inception early this month in an alleged attempt to make him the victim of what is commonly known as the "Badger game."  
A woman who was registered with a meise companion at a leading hotel endeavored to entice Mr. Russell to her apartments. Suspecting something more than the ordinary attempt to extort money by subsequent threats of exposure had the trick worked, Mr. Russell proceeded to investigate the matter.  
In the course of his inquiry, which took him several times to New York

and Pittsburg, Mr. Russell affirms that an attempt was made to have him sent surreptitiously to a sanitarium for the mentally unsound.  
There was a man in the case also, Mr. Russell alleges, who under the name of J. S. Patterson, stayed at the hotel with the woman. Russell engaged the Pinkertons to investigate the standing of both the man and woman, and alleges it was reported by the agency to him that the woman was a New York adventuress, while the man was said to be a reputable member of New York society and the general manager of a company capitalized at seven millions. Later it was admitted, so the writ sets forth, that the man was not as represented, but instead had a bad reputation and character. Ascertaining the falsity of the Pinkerton reports Mr. Russell dismissed them from his employ and demanded a return of two thousand dollars he had given their local manager as a retaining fee.  
It was then, according to the writ, that the Pinkerton detective agency, wilfully and maliciously conspired and plotted together and with other persons whose names are at present unknown to the plaintiff to ruin plaintiff and to injure him in his person, character, reputation, position, sensibilities and feelings.

...YOUNG RUSSIAN DROWNED IN SYDNEY  
SYDNEY, Jan. 22—The first skating on Sydney harbor cost the life of a young man, while several others had miraculous escapes. This afternoon, while skating near the Rocks bridge, a young Russian named Peter Voldodin, broke through the ice and in a few minutes was caught in the current and drowned, his body being carried under the ice. The ice is only a few days old and is still very dangerous. Voldodin was alone at the time, and was some distance

from several other skaters when he broke through. His cries attracted the attention of a young man named Grant, who at once went to his assistance, but could do little, and in the effort to rescue, almost lost his own life. The current, which is very strong at a distance and the ebb tide quite a distance and the ebb tide effort is being made the body has not yet been recovered, and the chances of its recovery at present are very slight.
