# HER HUBBY SKIPPED

## A Charlottetown Man Missing.

### SEARCH IN HALIFAX

Made by His Wife and Her Mother—They Missed Him There but Will Follow on—Another Woman in the Story.

Last evening a woman of about 50 rushed down the Plant wharf and started in to search for a man. A young woman of 25 accompanied her and the pair boarded the vessel and enquired for a well known Charlottetown man. The purser stated that no such person was on board the ship and the females seemed much disappointed. Together they walked up the street and came back later accompanied by a constable, who had come over from the Island. The two remained on the wharf until the boat pulled away, and then the young woman broke down completely and sobbed bitterly.

She was a deserted wife left alone in the world after a year of wedded life, by a faithless husband.

The girl was young, evidently about 25 years of age and very pretty. Her home had been a happy one until

to wreck the domestic felicity of the family.

The young woman, with tears in her eyes told her sad story of desertion and how she is thrown on her own resources, or must once again return to her father's home. Being high spirited she will probably endeavor to get on in the world as best she can, but before doing so she proposes, if possible, to bring to justice the man who left her for another. The mother is equally determined to see that her daughter gets her rights and is accompanying her with that object in view.

The husband left Charlottetown early this week and was supposed to have come down on the Halifax. This theory, however, was shattered last night when the party boarded the boat. No trace of the man had been seen about here and he had evidently left the P. E. I. capital by another route. A woman with whom he had been intimate disappeared at the same time and the wife was acquainted of the fact by relatives. Her decision as to how she should act was quickly formed and in company with her mother she at once started in pursuit of the fleeing husband. A constable with a warrant charging the man with desertion, made up the little party which arrived by train early in the evening, and at once proceeded to the Plant wharf.

That the husband might have gone by another route never occurred to the wife and mother, and they had little money when they reached town. The expectation of capturing the runaway and returning with him in triumph to Charlottetown put the women off their guard. When they found that the man they were looking for had given them the slip they spoke of purchasing tickets and proceeding at once to Boston, but their financial standing at the time would not permit such a move, so they decided to go home and then follow on at a later date.

The husband has no good start and it is doubtful if he will be located in a large city without great expense. Nevertheless the attempt will be made and the women state that they will at least have the runaway pair separated.

The three Charlottetown people left this morning. The young wife is in a delicate state of health and feels her position keenly.
