

"Grumpy" Will Be A Midsummer Attraction

Famous English Comedy Coming To Charlottetown. Eminent English Players in the Cast - Canadian Tour Starts in Maritime Province.

Cyril Maude's famous play "Grumpy" which comes to the Prince Edward Theatre for a two days engagement beginning Wednesday, June 23rd, matinee Thursday derives its title from an old criminal lawyer nicknamed "grumpy" by his adoring and adored granddaughter because of his octogenarian querulousness. He is retired from practice and with under his roof his grand-nephew is robbed of a valuable diamond sent home in his keeping by the South African firm he serves. The old man's sleuthhound instincts are awakened and he does not rest until he has discovered the thief and compelled restitution of the diamond.

This is slight material for a big play but the joint authors, Horace Hodges and Wingey Percival, are said to have built up a comedy that is evidently capable when played by Edward Levers, Frank Compton and others of not only gripping an audience but of holding their attention unremittingly from the opening to the final fall of the curtain. The whole plot hinges on a very trifling trifle indeed, nothing more than a girl's hair wound around the stem of a flower. But slighter things than this have betrayed criminals before now, and there is nothing illogical in the development of the plot, nor is there anything improbable in the story, which is based upon an incident that many people in the old country will remember having been a cause celebre some years ago. The "Grumpy" company, which consists of twenty eminent London players, will open their trans-Canada tour in the maritime provinces. Seats sale opens Monday 10 a. m. Mail orders now.

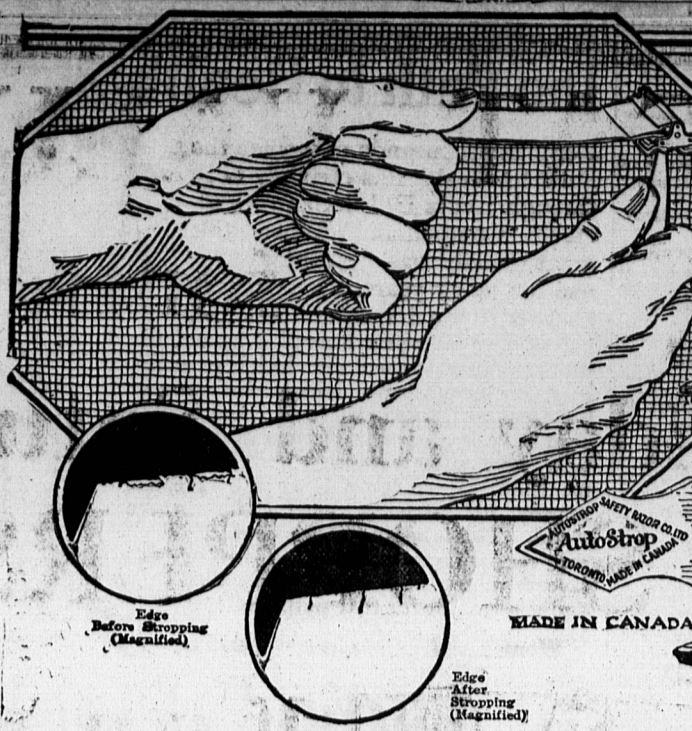
