FASHIONS FOR CANADIANS

The sketch presented today shows an early fall model just brought out and not yet on sale in the retail shops. The frock, designed especially for a young woman, is made of navy tricotine. The trimming consists of neat wool fringe, which is used to edge the long, open sleeves, collar, and jacket effect, and it appears in two bands at the bottom of the skirt. The feature of the skirt is the uneven length. It is decidedly shorter at the sides than at the back and front, and it is rather wide. The material is gathered in at the waist line, and the skirt hangs in unbroken lines, no suggestion of a drapery or draped effect being attempted. The collar may be released and left to flare open if preferred, as it is held at the neck by two ball-shaped buttons covered with red yarn. The dress fastens in the centre back with small red buttons.

An interesting point in connection with the first showing of fall frocks is the tendency to button many of them in the back, the buttons showing and giving a real trimming touch. The attempt to fasten a frock invisibly in the back is always rather unsuccessful, because rarely is the fastening actually concealed, and unless a woman has a maid or some one else upon whom she can depend to help her get into her clothes, the back fastening that is "invisible" is terribly trying to the nerves. When buttons are used in the conventional way a dress can be fastened in the back without much trouble.

Another feature of this frock that is worth observing is the little sash tied in the centre front. It is

Lloyd George Scores Railwaymen's Leaders

LONDON, June 7.—The text of Premier Lloyd George's conversation with National Union of Railwaymen leaders Thursday, with regard to the refusal of Irish railwaymen to handle munitions, was made public Saturday afternoon.

It shows that the Premier characterized the move as "one calculated to influence political decisions, not by the ordinary machinery of the state, but by bringing pressure to bear through the threat of disorganizing the industries of this country to effect changes which, up to the present, the electorate of this country has not sanctioned."

The Premier added: "That is a serious issue. I should regard it as a complete abdication of the Government if I were in the least to countenance this demand."

Mr. Lloyd George declared there had been forty-eight murders of police and 120 attempted murders in Ireland within a short time. The police, he asserted, were "shot down like vermin."

The Premier continued: "They were shot down in the street while carrying out the elementary duty of any force of this kind, the preservation of order. We send a box of revolvers across to these men to defend their lives, and the Trade Union comes in and



The Soviet Rule Fails to Stand the Real Test

BERLIN, June 6.—The elections to the Diet last Sunday in Gotha, which hitherto has been controlled by an Independent Socialist government of the radical type, confirm the earlier experience of Russia and other states, where the Independent Socialists held power for a time, that a brief trial of the soviet form of government suffices to convert the average German voter from radicalism and that he is apt to swing in the reaction well over into the conservative camp.

The unpopularity of the Independents, who during their tenure of office attempted to impose radical doctrines upon schools and church, was felt less in their own ranks, where about 10 per cent. of the revolutionary proletariat deserted the soviet cause, than by the regular Socialists and their allies of the Democratic party.

The bulk of the voters of these two parties represented in the federal coalition government voted conservative tickets as the most effective protest against radicalism. The conservative parties tripled their vote as compared with the last election and with nine seats in the future Diet lack but one of a majority.

The Independents, likewise with nine, lost their absolute majority, and one Democratic elector holds the balance of power. The regular Socialists are not represented. The Gotha elections are being interpreted as symptomatic of the trend in tomorrow's national elections to the Reichstag, but it is dangerous to carry the parallel too far. A swing toward the right will undoubtedly be felt, but to a less extent than in Gotha, where the object lesson of an extreme radical government was responsible for the smashing defeat of the two coalition parties.

Century of the British Empire

OTTAWA, June 7.—Lieut. Colonel Amery, M. P. British Under Secretary of State for the Colonies, was the chief speaker at the Canadian Club luncheon here Saturday. A distinguished gathering was in attendance, including His Excellency, the Duke of Devonshire, Sir Robert Borden, Hon. Mackenzie King, many of the cabinet ministers, and members of the West Indian Conference.

Colonel Amery addressed the club on the subject of "Imperial Development."

He emphasized that this did not mean the development of the interests of the Old Country with the resources of the rest of the Empire but the development of every part by their being drawn closer together and by co-operation in exchange of resources.

The meeting of the Canadian and West Indian Governments was in the true sense, Imperial development, he continued, Canada needed the West Indian products and could use more than the Western Indies could supply, while the West Indies required many Canadian products. The speaker stated that the manhood resources of the Empire were not properly distributed and claimed that one man who stays within the Empire is worth twice as much in the standpoint of trade and commerce as those who went from under the flag.

Out of a population of fifteen million the Dominions had contributed as much as the United States with her 100,000,000 to the recent great world conflict. As long as the Empire holds together and the men go from the British Isles to the Dominions the more openings there will be for the man power development in the Old Country.

In conclusion, Colonel Amery said that when the history of this country is written the twentieth century would be known as the century of the British Empire.

THE OVERFED CHICK

Overfeeding appears to be one of the evils that is usually indulged in when feeding the brooder chicks. Especially is this the case with beginners. They are prone to fear the chicks are not getting enough, and are therefore continually stuffing them. As a consequence the food lies around uneaten, becomes soiled and filthy and unfit to be eaten. Chicks fed in this manner often contract bowel trouble and even more serious ailments. It should be more generally realized that chicks require no food whatever from thirty six to forty-eight hours after hatching. Nature has provided for them during this time by the absorption of the yolk into the abdomen. To stuff them with food before they are in condition to assimilate it is to invite trouble. One cannot go against the laws of nature. Water however, may be provided the first day.
