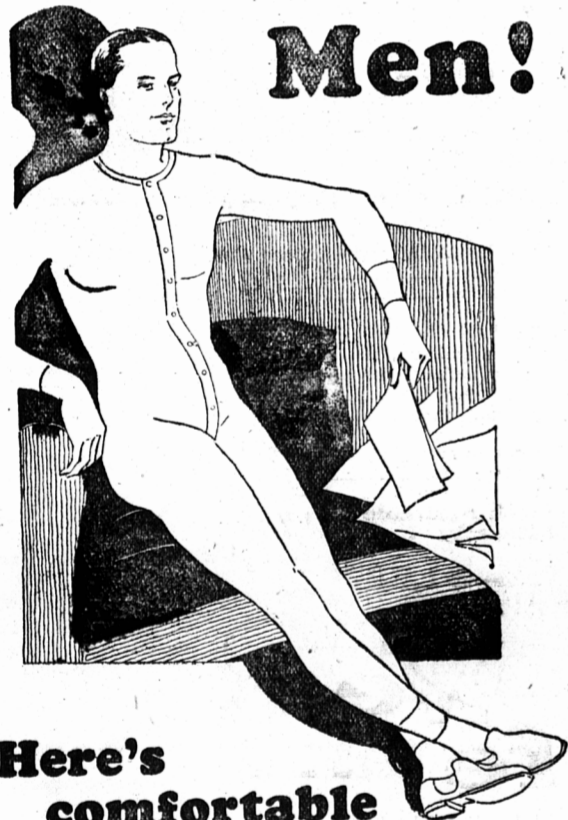

## Fugazy in Lists To Promote Fight

Competes With Rickard For Next World Champion Bout

NEW YORK, Nov. 18.—Firing the opening gun in a new heavy-weight war, Promoter Humbert J. Fugazy today entered into competition with Tex Rickard for the privilege of staging the next world's championship battle.

After a conference with Gene Tunney, Fugazy reported that the new title holder is not under contract to box for Rickard and that he expected to promote a bout between the champion and one of his outstanding challengers next summer.

"Tunney assured me he is not bound to any promoter and that he will be glad to fight for me if I can offer the right price for his services," said Fugazy.

Rickard admitted that he had no written contract with Tunney but said that a verbal agreement had been made prior to the Dempsey fight under which he was to select the champion's next opponent. This he was proceeding to do, he pointed out through an elimination series this winter between the leading contenders.

## St. John Paper And McTier Cup

ST. JOHN, Nov. 18.—The St. John Telegraph, in speaking of the McTier Cup matches, says:

"The question is where do the Halifax Wanderers come in on the matter? Where do they fit in view of their two decisive victories over the Collegians? Suppose the Wanderers had won from the New Brunswick college team by a close score. What would the sporting public of the Maritimes have thought of that, with the Wanderers' two wins in view? There is a cup down here in these provinces known as the McTier Cup and is emblematic of the football championship of the Maritime Provinces. Should it not be that the winners of that cup play-off, and are to be congratulated on their victory, but it does seem that the team to represent the Maritimes in the play-off should be champions.

The University of New Brunswick football team is a good one worthy of representing the Maritimes as they have proved in two successive years, yet the Wanderers are a better team as they have proven beyond the shadow of a doubt. Why deprive them of taking part in the play-off simply because they neglected to make formal entry during the middle of the season? New Brunswick congratulates the Collegians for bringing to this Province the McTier Cup and also congratulates the Halifax Wanderers on developing one of the nicest football machines in the Maritimes.

## Captures Title For 7th Time

Ralph Greenleaf Defeats Rudolph by Score of 125-53 in Final Match

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 18.—Ralph Greenleaf of New York tonight won the world's pocket billiard championship.

He defeated Erwin Rudolph of Chicago, 125 to 53, in the final match of the Round Robin Tournament which started at the Elks Club on November 6. This is the seventh time that Greenleaf has won the title since 1919, and he holds most of the records established in recent years.

At the close of the match it was announced that Rudolph had challenged Greenleaf and that they would meet again in a title match at Washington, D. C., on January 13.
