MY OWN TRUE LOVE GRIPPING FILM DRAMA

In early days, cream was skimmed from the top of milk left standing overnight in pans in a cool, deep cellar. Or cans of milk were immersed in cold water from the well or spring. 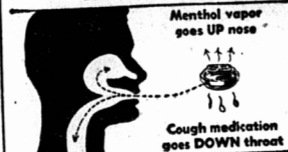
