Light Trading On Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, Nov. 25—(CP)—Irregularly marked light trading today on the stock exchange and curb market. Finding encouragement in strength displayed in New York on Saturday sentiment at the opening was flimsy. Irregularly set in around noon in sympathy again with Wall Street. Dryden was a feature in papers. It worked up 1 3/4 but closed for only 3/4 gain. The company declared a 15 cents per share irregular dividend today. In the balance of the group, higher were International, Consolidated, Price, Donnacona, Powell and Brown. Off were Abitibi Common, which opened harder. Abitibi Preferred, St. Lawrence and Bathurst. Improved in industrials were Stelco, C. Industries, Electrolux, Asbestos, Algoma, M. Locomotive, Ford and Cement. Eslier were Vero, Bessie, Plect, Olicloth, C. Locomotive, H. Bridge, C. Car and Massey. Dosco retrieved a slip. Bruck pushed up in textiles. In beverages, on the upside were Labatt, weaker in initial deals, Sticks, C. Breweries and Melcher Preferred. Walker was erratic but finished even. Lagards were Seagrams, following a better opening. Alco "A" and U. Distillers. M. Breweries and Alco "B" failed to hold lifts.

Brazilian, C. N. Power and U. Utilities advanced in utilities. Bell relinquished a gain and softer were Winnipeg Electric, B. C. Power "A", Gattineau, Shawinigan and Ottawa Power. Commerce was up and Royal down in banks. C. P. R. fell back in carriers. Nickel pushed up as a reaction to the company's announcement of increased prices in the United States for its products. Alcoa Preferred and Smelters were also higher in metals and Noranda and Aluminum were shaded. Petroleum tumbled in oil refineries and McCall and Imperial surrendered in chemicals. Royalville eased in western oils.

Winners in junior mines were Santiago, E. Sullivan, O'Brien and Heva. Rooding were Sullivan, C. Cadillac, Formaque and Necht. McDonald was off temporarily. Oglivie, David "B", Davis "A" and Lumber firmed in miscellaneous and Tobacco, up at the commencement of transactions. F. J. Agus, Lambert and C. (cell) lined up ahead of minuses. Prices Continue Depressed On N. Y. Exchange

NEW YORK, Nov. 25—AP—Selected stocks held to the recovery route in today's market, but many leaders were depressed by persistent pessimism over the national coal crisis. Dealings were among the slowest of the past three months. The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off .1 of a point at 61.5. Canadian stocks drifted downward at the close. Biggest losers were Distillers Seagram and McIntyre, each off 1-2. Hiram Walker and Canadian Pacific slipped 1-4 and Dome Mines 1-8. Lake Shore, on the curb, eased 1-8. Pleasing disbursements lifted Pacific Mills 1-2 at 32 1/2 and Jewel Tea 1-4 at 46 1/2. Youngstown Steel Door yielded 1-2 at 16. Kennecott was up 1-2 at 47 and Anaconda 1-4 at 39 1/4. Eastman Kodak advanced 3 at 213 and U.S. Gypsum 3 at 110 on meagre sales. Johns-Manville tacked on 1-8 at 123 and Standard Oil (NJ) 1-4 at 64. Improved were Chesapeake and Ohio, Republic Steel, United Aircraft, American Smelting, International Nickel, Phelps Dodge, American Can and J. C. Penney. Union Pacific dipped 2-4 at 124 1-4. Santa Fe 2-1-2 at 86. Du Pont 1-2 at 167 1-2. Great Northern 1-4 at 45 and Goodrich 1-2 at 61. In the stumbling column were Bethlehem, Chrysler, General Motors, Goodyear, U. S. Rubber, Pennsylvania Railroad, Northern Pacific, Baltimore and Ohio, Montgomery Ward, Douglas Aircraft, International Harvester, North American, Consolidated Edison, General Electric, Schenley and Woolworth.
