MUSIC IN QUEEN'S SQUARE.—Councillor Walker, Convenor of the Music Committee of the City Council, has arranged with the Citizens' Band to play a program of music in Queen's Square tonight (Tuesday) from 8 to 10 o'clock. BODY EXHUMED TO SETTLE AN INSURANCE DISPUTE.

TORONTO, Aug. 3.—To settle a dispute as to whether the late George Compton, who died in Toronto about

the middle of June, came to his death by accident or from other causes, the body was exhumed yesterday and a post-mortem examination made.

Deceased, who was a real estate dealer, had a substantial insurance policy. It appears he met with an accident shortly before his death, and subsequently the executors of his estate laid claim for the amount of his policy, contending that Mr. Compton's death was due to a fracture of the skull, the result of the accident. The insurance company refused pay-

ment and started an investigation, which culminated in the body being exhumed. The insurance company claims that its case has been strengthened as the result of the autopsy.
