THE CHINESE INDEMNITY.

It turns out that the delay in settling the amount of indemnity which China is to pay to the powers was mainly caused by their inability to agree among themselves. It is now agreed that China shall pay \$333,100,000 in forty yearly payments of about \$18,000,000 which will extinguish the bonds in that time with interest. It was proposed that the powers should guarantee the Chinese bonds, but this neither Great Britain nor the United States were willing to do—that is Great Britain would not, and the President of the United States could not do so without the authorisation of Congress.

It was the desire of Russia and the continental powers that the Chinese customs duties, which now average about 5 per cent. should be doubled to provide a fund for the annual payments of the indemnity. The Anglo-Saxon powers demurred to this, as their trade with China is larger than that of the other nations.

China has been all along very desirous to get rid of the foreign forces now occupying her territory, and has given her bonds for payment, but may still be dilatory in making payments. In case of neglect or refusal to pay, another joint expedition would be the only means of enforcing payment. And there is the possibility that with her badly managed finances China may be unable to keep up the annual payments, even if willing to do so.

A cable despatch intimates that in the amended title of the King no mention will be made specifically of either Canada or Australia. It is said Lord Salisbury has announced the title will possibly be as follows: "King Edward the VII, by the grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, and Emperor of India." We still think that the Dominion of Canada and the Commonwealth of Australia are of such importance that they ought to be named. Canada is more populous than Scotland or Ireland, and either Canada or Australia is as important a factor in the Empire as is India.

It seems unfortunately true, as the Examiner says, that the Duke of York is not coming to Prince Edward Island this fall. But it does not follow that the Island members of the South African contingents will have to pay their own way in going to Halifax to receive the medals from the hands of the Duke of Cornwall. The review to be held at Halifax of troops gathered from the three Maritime Provinces will afford the opportunity for our returned soldiers to be present at the cost of this country. We greatly regret that the Heir Apparent will not visit the Island, but there can be no good object in making grievances greater than the truth will warrant.

MEN AND WOMEN IN HEAVEN.

It is a strange incident that during the heated term a Chicago minister should arise to proclaim from the pulpit that in his opinion there are few men and many women in Heaven. Rev. W. B. Leach of the Methodist Episcopal Church, Chicago, is credited with the statement. He says he expects to be very lonesome in Heaven because of the lack of men there. "While women are going to Heaven, men are going to—well, somewhere else," says Rev. Mr. Leach. Surely this is "the foolishness of preaching," in a sense other than that Paul meant.

THE GUARDIAN does not believe that men are either better or worse than women as a class. In the Book from which Mr. Leach takes his texts there is no warrant for saying that the number of good men or of good women in this world or the next is the greater. So far as the sacred records go there seem to have been 12 Patriarchs, 12 Apostles and many Prophets, Bishops and Teachers in the olden time, nearly all of whom were men. The fact argues little however as to their piety or virtue as compared with the women of their time. It attests only their greater fitness for certain special service, but at the same time it certainly does not go to show that men live and move upon any lower moral and spiritual plane than their sisters.

Preaching to a congregation which was largely made up of women, Mr. Leach presumably thought he was flattering the feminine element there in his discourse. But in this he failed miserably. To the well constituted and healthful woman the vision of an "Adamless Eden" would hardly be an ideal one. And it was, to say the least, ungallant to speak of his prospective loneliness in a realm peopled with the spirits of myriads of good women. We make this reference solely as a warning to any who may hereafter be tempted to talk sentimental and speculative rubbish from the pulpit, where weightier matters should command the attention of all who preach and teach.

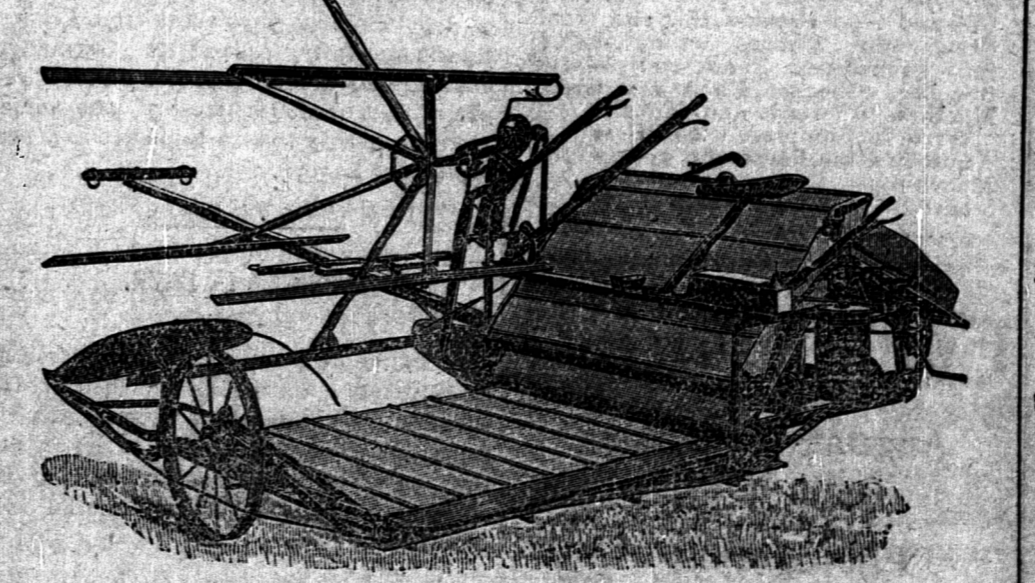
