OPENING OF THE LEGISLATURE.

The Provincial Legislature was opened yesterday afternoon with the usual ceremony, and notwithstanding the cold wind there was a full attendance of Members and a large gathering of spectators.

The Legislature of Prince Edward Island is one of the oldest law-making bodies on the continent of America. Established in 1773, it is older than the Congress of the United States, which first met in 1774.

Before the United States unfurled the banner of revolt, before the population of what is now the Dominion numbered one hundred and fifty thousand souls, and when our Island people were but a handful, our people obtained the boon of self-government with a Governor and Legislature of their own.

With the single exception of Halifax, Charlottetown enjoys the distinction of having been a capital city continuously for a longer period than any city in Canada. Ours is yet a small Province, hemmed in by the sea and our people yet all too few, but our population has become more to the square mile than that of any other Canadian Province, and has multiplied more than thirty fold since our Legislature was established.

His Honor, the Lieutenant Governor performed his function in opening the House with modest dignity. Hereafter until the day fixed for the closing, or for assenting to such bills as are passed, he may not enter or be present at any sitting of the House.

Interest is running high in the evangelistic services conducted by J. Ritchie Bell. On Sunday morning he preached an able sermon and in the evening he addressed an immense congregation in the Presbyterian church. A large number have publicly resolved to lead a Christian life. This evening's service will conclude Mr. Bell's great work in Alberton.

Sunday was a great day in Alberton. Large audiences attended the evangelistic services held in the Presbyterian Church both morning and evening. The morning theme was "The Spirit of Christ." Taking for his text Rom. 8-9, Evangelist J. Ritchie Bell said that the one conclusive proof that we belonged to Christ was that we were indwelt by His Spirit.

Speaking on the latter point Mr. Bell took occasion to say some pretty strong things against modern destructive criticism which he claimed was not new but as old as the devil. It had its origin in hell and was first introduced into this world by Satan, when he said to Eve "Ye hath God said."

In these latter days this species of unbelief has been re-introduced amid the fumes of tobacco smoke and German beer over in Germany. Christ believed the Bible, and has guaranteed the following facts related in the Old Testament. The creation of Adam and Eve, Matt. 19:4; The murder of Abel, Matt. 23:35; The story of Noah and the flood, Matt. 24, 37-39; The destruction of Sodom and of Lot's wife, Luke 17:28 and 32; The burning bush, Mark 12:23; Jonah and the great fish, Matt. 12:41. Christ claimed that Malachi wrote the Pentateuch Matt. 8:4. Isaiah wrote the book ascribed to him Luke 4:17. The scriptures (Genesis to Malachi) are the words of God, Mark 7:13. They cannot be broken John 10, 35. They testified of Him John 5:39 and 46. If they believe not Moses neither will they believe Christ, John 5:47. The Spirit of Christ was a Spirit of faith in the Word of God; if any man have not this Spirit He is none of His though he may be a Professor of theology in some college.

In the evening "Pilate's Problem" was the theme, and at the close of the address when the invitation was extended the enquirers thronged into the enquiry room and twenty-five new disciples of Christ were recorded the majority of which were young men. The singing has been an attractive feature of these meetings. A large union choir has been formed and many new hymns are sung each night. In addition to solos by the evangelist each evening he is often joined in duets by Miss Maud Wisener whose fine contralto voice is much appreciated. The meetings close tonight.

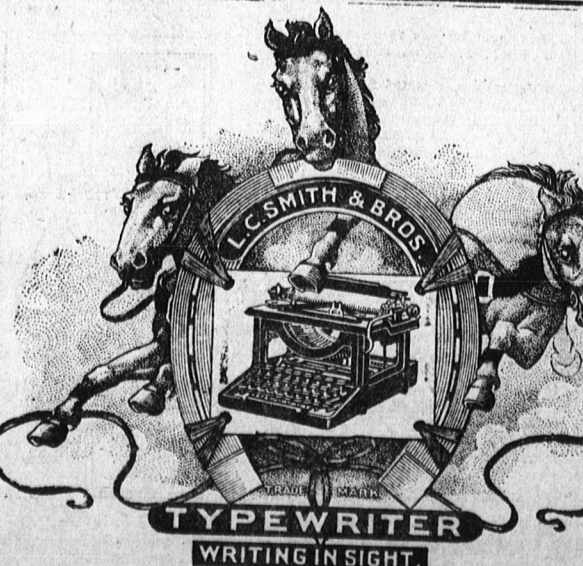
