## Alfalfa Increases Production

(Experimental Farms News)  
The alfalfa plant is remarkable for its ability to increase production along more lines than one. As a soil building crop it has few rivals. Its deep rooting characteristic enables it to utilize use of plant food reserves in the soil, and being a legume, it enriches the soil with nitrogen through the action of nitrifying bacteria.
