The case of Miss Hogan and Miss Perry against Miss Della Smith, Miss Emma Lewis, George Ward, Garfield Leard, Herbert McQueen, and Francis Larkin all charged with disorderly conduct in throwing stones and other missiles, came before Town Magistrate Fenton in the Court House, Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock.
