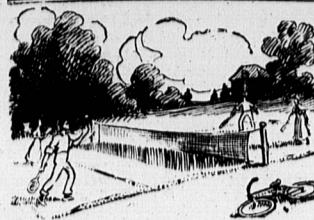

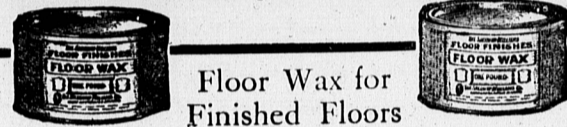

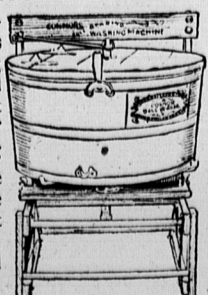

HOUSEKEEPING TEST FOR BRIDES. The question "will you be able to make a comfortable home for my son?"

"This question is as vital in importance and should be asked with as much frequency as is the old one. 'Can you support my daughter in the style she has been accustomed to?'"

These views expressed by Mrs. Edward M. Moore in a talk before the Women's Physiological Institute of Boston. Mrs. Moore made a strong plea for application of science and modern business methods of housekeeping.

She urged women to make housekeeping the business of their lives and declared that if they did they would feel less inclined to complain of the narrowness of their lot.

"The modern woman is trying to bring to her home-making, broader views, more accurate knowledge, and ideals of what the house should be and what it should stand for in the community," said Mrs. Moore. "This is the science of Home Economics."

The great value of this science lies in teaching us how to arrange the details of our life. Right here is the difference between the new ideals of the home and the old, our grandmothers' housekeeping was the end—with us it is the means.

"If woman could but realize that the care of her household, which it implies, is not the business of her life but a part of her life, she would be far less inclined to complain of the narrowness of her lot and would see that her position in the economic world is not one which is less dignified and more worthy of the means of maintenance for the household."

"How often do we not hear parents asking their prospective son-in-law, 'Are you able to support my daughter in the style she has been accustomed to?'"

Are you able to support my daughter in the style she has been accustomed to? Are you able to furnish her with a comfortable home? Seldom we hear the man's mother saying to the girl, 'Will you be able to make a comfortable home for my son?'"

"Housekeeping should be regarded as a business enterprise. Yet it is difficult to run a business where so great a versatility is required of its head. She must be a dietitian, sanitary officer, cook, seamstress, instructor of household helpers, expert in the care of children, social head, and must be able to coordinate all these functions properly."

"It is a well-known fact that it is less economical to run a home than a hotel, than a boarding house. What, then, is the justification of the home? It is the ideal place for the rearing of children, for providing such desirable conditions for a small business as cannot be had by other method of living, and consequently well worth the added cost. Common nurseries, common kitchens, etc., would reduce our expenditures greatly, but they leave out of consideration character building and training for good citizenship, which can be obtained only in the family. The problem therefore, is to retain these advantages with the greatest possible economy. The reason this has not been done before, at a time when all problems are being attracted acutely, is partly due to a backwardness of the women themselves."

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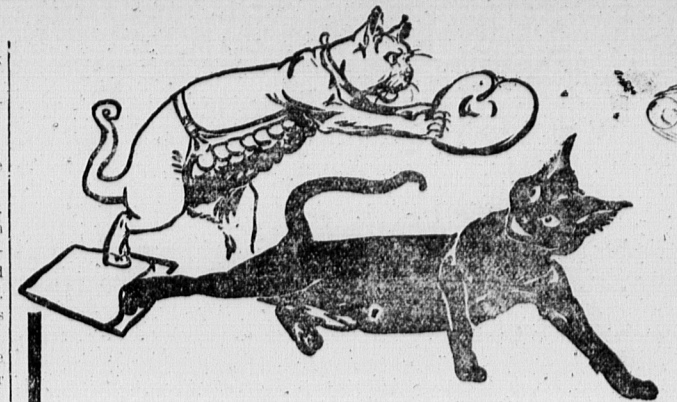
