### Vote Confidence In Poincare

(Special to The Guardian)  
PARIS, Jan. 12.—Premier Raymond Poincare was established firmly at the head of the French Government today with a strong majority. The Premier laid his cards on the table before the chamber of deputies in a dramatic session last night, and was rewarded with a vote of confidence immediately after a non-confidence motion had been defeated.

The confidence vote was 325 to 251, a majority of 74. The radical socialists' non-confidence motion was defeated 317 to 253. Premier Poincare and Foreign Minister Briand today were able to go ahead with a series of international negotiations now underway to settle questions left over by the war, assured of the support of parliament.

### Livestock Market

(Canadian Press)

MONTREAL, Jan. 16.—There were 39 cattle, 43 calves, 201 hogs and three lambs for fresh arrivals, for sale on the two markets, and in addition 298 cattle, held over from Monday and Tuesday. Monday's decline in cattle prices was still in force, and sales were very drab. One lot of good 1200 pound steers sold for \$10.00. Plain to medium cows were selling from \$5.00 to \$6.50 or in spots nearly \$1.00, lower than last week. Canners and cutters from \$3.25 to \$4.50, and common bulls from \$5.00, for light thin yearlings, up to \$7.50 for fleshy bulls of good weights. Veal calves were in good demand and sold for \$14.00 to \$15.00 with the bulk of sales at \$14.50. Lamb quotations were unchanged, \$10.75 was the standard quotation on hogs. Sows were from \$8.50 to \$9.00.

### The Land We Love

The First Roman Catholic Bishop in Upper Canada.

Q. Who was the first Roman Catholic Bishop in Upper Canada?  
A. The first Roman Catholic Bishop in Upper Canada (now Ontario) was Alexander Macdonell, who was consecrated as Bishop of Regiopolis on February 14, 1838. He was a soldier as well as a priest, serving as Chaplain of the Glengarry Light Infantry, which took part in the capture of Ogdensburg, N. Y., on February 13, 1813. Cross in hand, he marched on one flank of the British force (composed of the Glengarry Light Infantry and the Glengarry Militia), while the Presbyterian Chaplain (Rev. Mr. MacKenzie), holding up his Bible, marched on the other flank, both urging on their adherents.

### COCOANUT CUSTARD

Butter an earthenware dish and put in about a quarter of a pound of coconut. Add 26 marshmallows cut in halves, 1 cupful chopped English walnuts, and then a layer of about one quarter of a pound of grated coconut. Beat two eggs and add half a cupful of sugar, two cupfuls of milk, and a half teaspoonful of vanilla. Pour this over the mixture in the dish and bake in a slow oven (250 degrees). Serve this dessert cold.
