### PARLIAMENT AND PRESS GALLERY.

Parliament is becoming critical of the press gallery, and a threat has gone forth that some of the scribes may be called to the bar of the Commons, if they are not less free in their criticisms. The threat will have small terrors for the newspaper men. Of course it is within the power of the House to summon any member of the press gallery to the bar, and he may be there examined and if found guilty of wrong-doing may be asked to apologise or retract, and in default of so doing may be compelled to abandon his seat in the gallery, or even be placed in the custody of the Sergeant at Arms.

Usually the relations between members and pressmen are most friendly and cordial. If a member is misrepresented or misreported it is usually by accident or inadvertence. A member has only to call attention to the error and his correction is at once telegraphed all over the country. And the aggrieved member has always the right of redress in the courts. No reputable newspaper will permit its correspondents to misrepresent the sayings or doings of members, or other persons, but the right of fair criticism must be preserved. Members like to stand well with the newspapers, for obvious reasons. Because of this no member of the press gallery at Ottawa has yet, we believe, been called to answer

at the bar of the House.

In the olden times press correspondents were occasionally threatened with personal violence by members who thought themselves aggrieved by something written and published. In a few cases actual assaults were committed, but these were rare and did not always turn out advantageously to the assailant. A well known Ottawa correspondent was once threatened with a thrashing by Mr. Bunker of British Columbia for what he thought to be a too graphic account of the fight between him and a Quebec Member named Cheval, in a locked room of the House of Commons. But the subsequent interview between Member and newspaper man ended without violence, and with the effect of adding a second good newspaper story to the first.

Such incidents are rare in recent years. The Commons has improved somewhat in decorum in a generation past, and the press gallery usually contains enough good men to command the respect of both the House and the country. Members will do well to not be too critical of the press men who are in attendance upon Parliament. They are much indebted to the newspapers, for almost all that the people read of the sayings and doings in the Commons is what is recorded in the press. Few people see the Hansard reports and still fewer have the time to peruse the long reports there given of speeches, not one in five of which is really important enough to engage attention.

## TOUGHS TOOK AN EGG MAN'S WAD

KEMPTVILLE, May 14.—Yesterday William Jackson, egg buyer, went to his barn to hitch up for his day's work. As he approached the door two rough looking men emerged, and one of them drawing a revolver, held Jackson up, compelling him to enter the barn. There they relieved him of \$25 he had in his pockets, and after binding and gagging their victim disappeared. It was some time before he was able to work the gag out of his mouth and then his calls speedily brought assistance from passersby. The only trace of the men who committed the robbery is their foot tracks across a ploughed field.
