RESOLUTION RE STOCK FARM DISCUSSED.

Lots 27 and 28 Farmers' Institute held a meeting in Seartown Hall Jan 18th. Session was opened at 2:30 p. m., by the president, G. W. Cameron who stated that the first subject to come before the meeting was the resolution re Stock Farm, which was laid over from the Cape Traverse meeting of the 11th inst. The Sec'y read the resolution as follows: Whereas the Provincial Farm has ceased to be as useful as a stock-producing centre as it formerly was; And Whereas one of the things most important to our farmers today is the dairy industry; And Whereas an Experimental Station for the testing of varieties of grain and methods of cultivation would be of great benefit to this Province; Therefore Resolved that we approve of the establishment of a Model Dairy Farm and Experimental Station in place of what is now known as the Government Stock Farm, and that the Local Department of Agriculture be asked to take such steps as shall be necessary for the proper equipment of such Model Dairy Farm and Experiment Station. A. S. Wright began the discussion by saying that we have in the past received much benefit from the Stock Farm, and he believed if there was a man to manage it, the Farm would still be of great value as a place where we could procure pure bred stock at a reasonable price. Chas. Craig said he did not think much of the stock on the Farm at present; and that they should procure a few of the best animals obtainable of some good dairy breed. He thought the Ayrshires were the best for the average farmer. He also advocated that they be handled as dairy cattle should be, and not let the calves run with the cows all summer as had been done in the past. He also claimed that the Federal Government should take charge of the experimental work on the Farm. The President said the mistake made in the past was that the men sent to procure stock for the Farm did not understand their business. James Affleck said he never saw much benefit from the Farm, except to a few farmers near Charlottetown; and that the stock sent out hurt private enterprises. He thought the pedigrees of stock were often a fraud, and he failed to see where the Farm paid in any way. He also claimed we should have an experimental station, for we do not derive much benefit from the Farm at Nappan as the soil was so different from ours. He thought in view of its past record the Stock Farm should be sold to the highest bidder. Chas. Craig said the stock of the Short-horn breed procured from the Farm had certainly been a great help to the farmers of the western part of this Island. He had seen some fine herds of cattle which had been raised from that stock. J. Affleck said if the Farm could be remodelled and managed so that it would not be sinking money he would be willing to retain it. A. S. Wright said matter did not hinge on the question of whether it paid or not, but has it been a benefit to our farmers in general? He thought the benefits derived more than balanced any money loss that had been incurred. Chas. Craig said if they would pay high enough for stock of some good dairy breed and handle them right, we farmers would receive great benefit. J. Affleck asserted that there was no need of going to Ontario for Short-horn stock, as our Island breeders have as good cattle as can be found in the Dominion. G. Pickering said the experimental part of the Farm was a failure. If they had two herds of dairy cattle also two of beef cattle and a proper record kept of the value of milk and beef produced the farmers would know what they were doing when they bought the young stock. The President said if two herds of cattle, one of the dairy and the other of the beef breed, were tested for two or four

The following resolution was moved by A. S. Wright and seconded by Chas. Craig: "Whereas the Dairy Industry is being looked to as a source of wealth to this Island; And Whereas the best strain of milk producing stock reached our Island in connection with our Local Government: Therefore Resolved that in the opinion of this Institute our Local Government should put forth every effort to procure the very best cattle of the milk strain to be distributed throughout our Island also some of the best breed of beef cattle. And Further Resolved that any move to establish an experimental station by our Local Government be discouraged as we deem that the duty of the Federal Government in order to place us (a purely agricultural province) in line with our sister provinces."

After some further discussion the meeting voted unanimously in favor of the resolution. The committee appointed at Cape Traverse meeting reported through A. S. Wright. They had prepared circulars to be sent to all our Institutes calling for a meeting of delegates from each Institute to be held in Charlottetown Feb 6th to discuss the Salary Grab, Pension Scheme, etc. It was decided to lay this matter over until after the meeting in Summerside on the 29th inst. Delegates to the above meeting were now appointed viz. Lewis Trueman, S. Caruthers, J. Hayes. This brought to a close a very lively and interesting meeting. JAMES E. HOWATT, Secretary.
