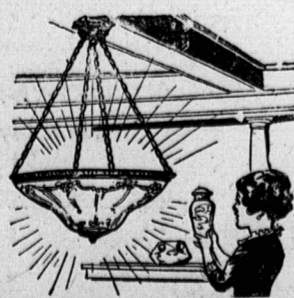

venture Street, to the C. P. R. Station on Windsor Street which is one of the finest and most up-to-date railway passenger depot in the world. As we had twelve hours in Montreal we visited many places of interest, such as Victoria and Dominion Parks, Mount Royal, the Department stores on St. Catherine St., the Windsor Hotel and the great Roman Catholic Cathedral.

As we left Montreal at 10 p. m. we did not see Ottawa or any place of much interest in Ontario. For two days we travelled through a bleak rocky country, with mountains, lakes and scrub brush, with the exception of Port Arthur, Port William and Kenora.

We got to Winnipeg at 9 p. m. and left at 9:30, so we didn't see much of Manitoba. In Saskatchewan we saw great fields of grain, we never saw anything like it before. We stayed 24 hours in Calgary, which is a very fine city, has fine well kept streets, splendid stores and Hotels, beautiful parks and residences with well kept grounds. It is a live up-to-date city. We also had the pleasure of meeting Miss Margaret McSwain who is teaching in Cornwall School, and you better believe school teachers get an salary here, about three times what they get on P. E. I. Mrs. Perry and Miss McSwain are daughters of Mr. Norman McSwain of Mount Hope, P. E. I., who has been here visiting for the last six months combining business with pleasure. 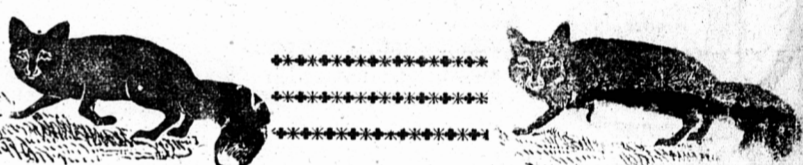

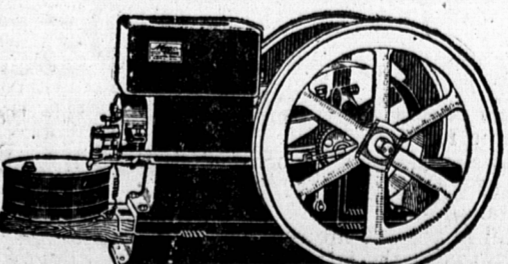

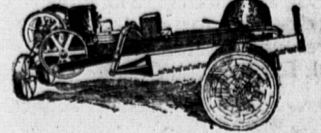
