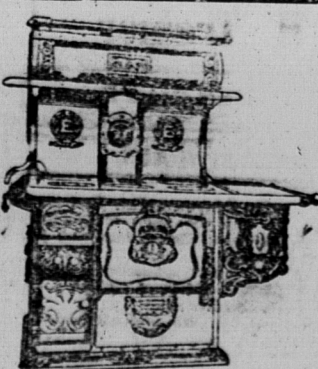

COLLIERY FIRE OUT

Messrs Ferguson and Purchase were accompanied by six workmen, making preparations for the starting of the mine.

The explosion occurred and the village of Florence was turned into a frenzy. People rushed to the colliery and Superintendent Brown was immediately summoned. The Superintendent soon got in touch with the mining department. John Johnson, accompanied by Robert Hobson and other colliery officers, soon had a dragger apparatus upon the scene, and in a few minutes all available workmen on the plant were combating the fire.

For eight hours John H. Johnston, assisted by Inspector Nicholson worked down upon No. 11 lift and finally in finding the charred bodies of the six shiftmen, who were clumped together and so burned that it was impossible to recognize one from another.

The rescuing party worked hard to reach No. 14 lift in the hope of recovering the bodies of Ferguson and Purchase, but owing to deadly gasses they were compelled to retreat.

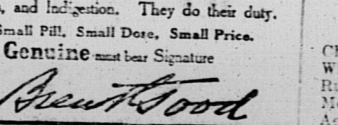
